A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Hawaii's children
deserve a quality education in a clean and safe environment.
Many schools have leaky roofs, termite-infested floors,
crumbling walls, and overheated classrooms. The legislature
further finds that there is a compelling need to immediately
fund the backlog of repair and maintenance projects in the
public schools.

8 In 2001, the legislature appropriated funds to help mitigate the department of education's estimated \$640,000,000 9 10 backlog of repair and maintenance projects. In 2007, the 11 estimated backlog of repair and maintenance projects was 12 \$341,000,000, which included recurring major and minor repairs, ongoing cycle maintenance, service and contract maintenance, 13 nonrecurring projects, and emergency repairs. Unfortunately, 14 15 due in part to the governor's decision not to release 16 \$140,000,000 previously approved by the legislature during past legislative sessions for repair and maintenance projects of the 17

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1 department of education, the backlog remains and continues to increase. In 2008, the backlog increased to approximately 2 \$421,000,000 and declined slightly to \$347,000,000 by September 3 4 of 2009, but is expected to increase by an additional 5 \$75,000,000 during upcoming fiscal years. 6 It is the intent of the legislature to reduce the backlog 7 of repair and maintenance projects within the public schools to 8 a manageable level. To meet this objective, this Act authorizes 9 the issuance of general obligation bonds and appropriates \$155,000,000 annually through fiscal year 2012 for repair and 10 maintenance projects of the department of education. At the 11 12 rate of \$155,000,000 annually, the backlog will be reduced after 13 three years, as follows: 14 FY2010 FY2011 FY2012 Current backlog \$347,000,000 \$267,000,000 \$187,000,000 15 16 Annual increase \$75,000,000 \$75,000,000 \$75,000,000 17 GO funding (\$155,000,000) (\$155,000,000) (\$155,000,000) Remaining R&M \$267,000,000 \$187,000,000 \$107,000,000 18 19 The purpose of this part is to authorize the issuance of general obligation bonds and appropriate the revenues derived 20 21 therefrom to reduce the backlog of repair and maintenance 22 projects of the department of education. 2010-0882 SB2279 SD1 SMA.doc

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1	SECTION 2. The director of finance is authorized to issue
2	general obligation bonds in the sum of \$ or so much
3	thereof as may be necessary and the same sum or so much thereof
4	as may be necessary is appropriated for fiscal year 2010-2011
5	for the purpose of funding the department of education's repair
6	and maintenance projects.
7	The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
8	education for the purposes of this part.
9	SECTION 3. The appropriation made for the capital
10	improvement projects authorized by this part shall not lapse at
11	the end of the fiscal biennium for which the appropriation is
12	made; provided that all moneys from the appropriation in
13	section 2 unencumbered as of June 30, 2012, shall lapse as of
14	that date.
15	SECTION 4. If any provision of this Act, or the
16	application thereof to any person or circumstance is held
17	invalid, the invalidity does not affect other provisions or
18	applications of the Act, which can be given effect without the
19	invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions
20	of this Act are severable.
21	SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2010.
