BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 383, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated	
3	and to read as follows:	
4	"§383- Requirement to post work availability online. To	
5	meet the	online registration for work requirements under section
6	383-1, the department shall:	
7	(1)	Allow an individual to post the required information
8		independently on the department's internet job-
9		matching system; or
10	(2)	Accept information provided by the individual in the
11		form prescribed by the department, and enter the
12	1	necessary information on the department's Internet
13		job-matching system for the individual.
14	The	employment office shall provide the necessary
15	information to the unemployment office for purpose of	
16	determining that the individual's registration for work	
17	requirements has been met."	

- 1 SECTION 2. Section 383-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by amending the definition of "registered for work" or 3 "registration for work" to read as follows: 4 ""Registered for work" or "registration for work" means 5 that an individual shall provide information to the employment 6 office to be posted on the department's internet job-matching 7 system, including [but-not limited to] the individual's name, 8 job skills, education, training, prior employment history and 9 work duties, preferred working conditions, occupational **10** licenses, and other relevant occupational information to 11 facilitate work search efforts by the individual and increase 12 job referrals by the employment office. [The information shall 13 be posted with the department's assistance or independently by 14 the individual. The employment office shall provide the 15 necessary information to the unemployment office for purposes of 16 determining that the individual's registration for work 17 requirements has been met.] "
- 20 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
