A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MILITARY AND OVERSEAS CIVILIAN ABSENTEE VOTERS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 15, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended 2 by adding a new part to be appropriately designated and to read 3 as follows: 4 MILITARY AND OVERSEAS CIVILIAN ABSENTEE VOTERS "PART 5 **§15-A Definitions.** For the purpose of this part: 6 "Absent uniformed services voter" means: 7 (1)A member of a uniformed service on active duty who, by 8 reason of active duty, is absent from the place of 9 residence where the member is otherwise qualified to 10 vote; 11 (2)A member of the merchant marine who, by reason of 12 service in the merchant marine, is absent from the 13 place of residence where the member is otherwise 14 qualified to vote; or 15 A spouse or dependent of a member referred to in (3) 16 paragraph (1) or (2) who, by reason of the active duty 17 or service of the member, is absent from the place of



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1	residence where the spouse or dependent is otherwise
2	qualified to vote.
3	"Balloting materials" means, as applicable, the official
4	post card forms prescribed under title 42 United States Code
5	section 1973ff, federal write-in absentee ballots, prescribed
6	under title 42 United States Code section 1973ff-2, and any
7	other materials prescribed by the chief elections officer by
8	rule, which may include but not be limited to those described in
9	section 15-6.
10	"Covered election" means any presidential, United States
11	senatorial, or congressional election.
12	"Member of the merchant marine" means an individual (other
13	than a member of a uniformed service or an individual employed,
14	enrolled, or maintained on the Great Lakes or the inland
15	waterways) who is:
16	(A) Employed as an officer or crew member of a vessel
17	documented under the laws of the United States, or a
18	vessel owned by the United States, or a vessel of
19	foreign-flag registry under charter to or control of
20	the United States; or
21	(B) Enrolled with the United States for employment or
22	training for employment, or maintained by the United



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1		States for emergency relief service, as an officer or
2		crew member of any such vessel.
3	"Ove	rseas civilian voter" means a United States citizen who
4	is outsid	e the United States and who:
5	(1)	Is qualified to vote in this State;
6	(2)	Would be eligible to vote in this State, if this State
7		was the last place in which the citizen was eligible
8		to vote, or, if the citizen had been of voting age,
9		would have been eligible to vote, before leaving the
10		United States; or
11	(3)	In the case of a citizen who was born outside the
12		United States and who is not included in paragraph (1)
13		or (2), would be eligible to vote in this State if a
14		resident of this State and if this State was the last
15		place in the United States in which one of the
16		citizen's parents was eligible to vote.
17	"Uni	formed services" means the Army, Navy, Air Force,
18	Marine Co	rps, and Coast Guard, the United States Public Health
19	Service C	ommissioned Corps, and the National Oceanic and
20	Atmospher	ic Administration Commissioned Corps.

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1 "United States", where used in the territorial sense, means 2 the fifty states, the District of Columbia, the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, Guam, the Virgin Islands, and American Samoa. 3 4 §15-B Transmission of unvoted ballot. (a) For all 5 covered elections, the official charged with preparing and 6 distributing ballots and election materials in each jurisdiction 7 shall prepare a sufficient number of absentee ballots as soon as 8 possible after receiving information concerning candidates to be 9 voted on at the election and shall immediately transmit absentee 10 ballots and related balloting materials to all absent uniformed 11 services voters and overseas civilian voters who have applied 12 for an absentee ballot. 13 No later than forty-five days before a covered (b) 14 election, each clerk, with the assistance of the chief election 15 officer, as appropriate, shall make available by electronic 16 means, which may include facsimile transmission or electronic 17 mail, an unvoted absentee ballot and related balloting materials 18 to any absent uniformed services voter or overseas voter who, by 19 that date, has submitted a valid absentee ballot application

20 requesting electronic transmission of absentee balloting

21 materials.

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1 An absent uniformed services voter or overseas (C)2 civilian voter may request to receive an absentee ballot and 3 related balloting materials by electronic mail, or internet 4 delivery, where available. Each clerk, with the assistance of 5 the chief election officer, shall transmit the absentee ballot 6 and related balloting materials to the voter using the 7 electronic transmission method requested by the voter. 8 When an absentee ballot application of an absent (d) 9 uniformed services voter or overseas voter arrives after the 10 jurisdiction has begun transmitting absentee balloting materials 11 to voters, the official charged with distributing ballots and 12 related balloting materials shall transmit the absentee 13 balloting materials to the voter as promptly as possible. 14 §15-C Acceptance of federal write-in absentee ballot. (a) 15 In a covered election, an absent uniformed services voter or an 16 overseas voter may use the federal write-in absentee ballot 17 approved under the Uniformed and Overseas Citizens Absentee 18 Voting Act, title 42 United States Code sections 1973ff through 19 1973ff-6, if the voter affirms that:

20 (1) The voter submitted a federal post card application or
21 other application requesting a federal absentee ballot
22 in time to be received by the later of:



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1	(A) Thirty days prior to the election, or
2	(B) The last date for other voters in the State to
3	apply for an absentee ballot for the election;
4	and
5	(2) The voter has not received the requested absentee
6	ballot.
7	(b) In a covered election, an absent uniformed services
8	voter or an overseas civilian voter may use the federal write-in
9	absentee ballot transmission envelope's voter declaration as a
10	request for registration and an application for a state absentee
11	ballot simultaneous with the submission of the federal write-in
12	absentee ballot. The request for registration and application
13	for an absentee ballot shall be accepted if:
14	(1) It is received by the later of the thirty days prior
15	to the election, or the last day for registering to
16	vote; and
17	(2) The voter is otherwise eligible to vote in the
18	jurisdiction to which the request is submitted."
19	SECTION 2. Section 15-3.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
20	repealed.
21	[" [§15-3.5] Federal write-in absentee ballot.
22	Notwithstanding the provisions of this chapter and chapters 11

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1	and 16, the federal write-in absentee ballot for overseas voters
2	in general elections for federal office which must be prescribed
3	under section 1973ff of title 42, United States Code, as
4	amended, may be used in general elections for federal offices."]
5	SECTION 3. Sections 15-1 to 15-14, Hawaii Revised
6	Statutes, are designated as part I entitled "General
7	Provisions".
8	SECTION 4. In codifying the new sections added by
9	section 1 of this Act, the revisor of statutes shall substitute
10	appropriate section numbers for the letters used in designating
11	the new sections in this Act.
12	SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
13	and stricken.
14	SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on January 1, 2055.
