A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE HAWAII TEACHER STANDARDS BOARD.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the fifteen member 2 Hawaii teacher standards board is responsible for establishing 3 standards for the issuance and renewal of licenses for teachers; 4 serves as the adjudicator for appeals relating to licensing, 5 including issuance or non-issuance of licenses, and the suspension, non-renewal, and revocation of licenses; and 6 7 approves teacher education programs. 8 The purpose of this Act is to make clarifying and other 9 amendments to the powers and duties of the Hawaii teacher 10 standards board to: 11 (1)Expedite the issuance of licenses processed by the 12 board; and 13 (2) Enable the board to fulfill its duties while also 14 maintaining its power and responsibilities. 15 SECTION 2. Section 302A-803, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 16 `amended to read as follows:

4	(2)	Adopting, amending, or repealing the rules of the
5		board in accordance with chapter 91;
6	(3)	Receiving grants or donations from private
7		foundations, and state and federal funds;
8	(4)	Submitting an annual report to the governor, the
9		legislature, and the board of education on the board's
10		operations, and from the 2007-2008 school year,
11		submitting a summary report every five years of the
12		board's accomplishment of objectives, efforts to
13		improve or maintain teacher quality[$ au$] and efforts to
14		keep its operations responsive and efficient;
15	(5)	Conducting a cyclical review of standards and
16		suggesting revisions for their improvement;
17	(6)	Establishing licensing fees in accordance with chapter
18		91 and determining the manner by which fees are
19		collected and subsequently deposited into the state
20		treasury and credited to the Hawaii teacher standards
21		board special fund;
22	(7)	Establishing penalties in accordance with chapter 91;



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1	(8)	Issuing, renewing, revoking, suspending, and
2		reinstating licenses;
3	(9)	Reviewing reports from the department on individuals
4		hired on an emergency basis;
5	(10)	Applying licensing standards on a case-by-case basis
6		and conducting licensing evaluations;
7	(11)	Preparing and disseminating teacher licensing
8		information to schools and operational personnel;
9	(12)	Approving teacher preparation programs;
10	(13)	Administering reciprocity agreements with other states
11		relative to licensing;
12	(14)	Conducting research and development on teacher
13		licensure systems, beginning teacher programs, the
14		assessment of teaching skills, and other related
15		topics;
16	(15)	Participating in efforts relating to teacher quality
17		issues, professional development related to the
18		board's standards, and promotion of high teacher
19		standards and accomplished teaching;
20	(16)	Adopting applicable rules and procedures; and
21	(17)	Adopting, amending, repealing, or suspending the
22		policies and standards of the board.

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1 (b) If, in accordance with chapter 92, the board 2 determines, on a case-by-case basis, that extenuating 3 circumstances exist to justify the suspension, the board may 4 temporarily suspend its rules, or any portion thereof. The 5 board shall establish, in accordance with chapter 91, procedures 6 for the suspension of its rules. When determining whether to 7 suspend its rules, the board shall also establish the length of time for which the suspension shall be in effect. 8 9 The board, in accordance with chapter 92, may also (C) amend licensing-related fees and set or amend other charges 10 11 related to the performance of its duties. 12 The board may delegate to the executive director or (d) 13 other designee any powers and duties of the board as it deems 14 reasonable and proper. The delegation of powers and duties 15 shall be made by formal action of the board, in accordance with 16 rules adopted by the board pursuant to chapter 91 and board 17 policies and upon the concurrence of a majority of all members 18 to which the board is entitled. 19 Notwithstanding any other law, the board shall not (e) 20 delegate to the executive director or other designee any 21 discretionary functions that result in a final decision related 22 to:



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1	(1)	Adopting, amending, or repealing rules;
2	(2)	Ordering disciplinary action against a licensee or
3		permit holder, including the revocation, suspension,
4		or imposition of conditions or fines; provided that
5		summary suspensions may be delegated; and
6	(3)	Granting, denying, or otherwise conditioning license
7		and permit applications, unless the granting, denying,
8		or otherwise conditioning of a license or permit does
9		not require the exercise of the board's expertise and
10		discretion.
