# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE HAWAII TEACHER STANDARDS BOARD.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the fifteen-member
 Hawaii teacher standards board is responsible for establishing
 standards for the issuance and renewal of licenses for teachers;
 serves as the adjudicator for appeals relating to licensing,
 including issuance or non-issuance of licenses, and the
 suspension, non-renewal, and revocation of licenses; and
 approves teacher education programs.

8 The purpose of this Act is to make clarifying and other 9 amendments to the powers and duties of the Hawaii teacher 10 standards board to authorize the board to delegate certain 11 powers and duties to its executive director or other designee. 12 SECTION 2. Section 302A-803, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

13 amended to read as follows:

14 "§302A-803 Powers and duties of the board. (a) In
15 addition to establishing standards for the issuance and renewal
16 of licenses and any other powers and duties authorized by law,
17 the board's powers shall also include:

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1	(2)	Adopting, amending, or repealing the rules of the
2		board in accordance with chapter 91;
3	(3)	Receiving grants or donations from private
4		foundations, and state and federal funds;
5	(4)	Submitting an annual report to the governor, the
6		legislature, and the board of education on the board's
7		operations, and from the 2007-2008 school year,
8	1	submitting a summary report every five years of the
9		board's accomplishment of objectives, efforts to
10		improve or maintain teacher quality, and efforts to
11		keep its operations responsive and efficient;
12	(5)	Conducting a cyclical review of standards and
13		suggesting revisions for their improvement;
14	(6)	Establishing licensing fees in accordance with chapter
15		91 and determining the manner by which fees are
16		collected and subsequently deposited into the state
17		treasury and credited to the Hawaii teacher standards
18		board special fund;
19	(7)	Establishing penalties in accordance with chapter 91;
20	(8)	Issuing, renewing, revoking, suspending, and
21		reinstating licenses;



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1	(9)	Reviewing reports from the department on individuals
2		hired on an emergency basis;
3	(10)	Applying licensing standards on a case-by-case basis
4		and conducting licensing evaluations;
5	(11)	Preparing and disseminating teacher licensing
6		information to schools and operational personnel;
7	(12)	Approving teacher preparation programs;
8	(13)	Administering reciprocity agreements with other states
9		relative to licensing;
10	(14)	Conducting research and development on teacher
11		licensure systems, beginning teacher programs, the
12		assessment of teaching skills, and other related
13		topics;
14	(15)	Participating in efforts relating to teacher quality
15		issues, professional development related to the
16		board's standards, and promotion of high teacher
17		standards and accomplished teaching;
18	(16)	Adopting applicable rules and procedures; and
19	(17)	Adopting, amending, repealing, or suspending the
20		policies and standards of the board.
21	(b)	If, in accordance with chapter 92, the board
22	determine	s, on a case-by-case basis, that extenuating



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circumstances exist to justify the suspension, the board may
 temporarily suspend its rules, or any portion thereof. The
 board shall establish, in accordance with chapter 91, procedures
 for the suspension of its rules. When determining whether to
 suspend its rules, the board shall also establish the length of
 time for which the suspension shall be in effect.

7 (c) The board, in accordance with chapter 92, may also
8 amend licensing-related fees and set or amend other charges
9 related to the performance of its duties.

10 The board may delegate to its executive director, or (d) other designee, any of its powers and duties as it deems 11 12 reasonable and proper; provided that the delegation of powers 13 and duties by the board shall be made in accordance with 14 procedures set forth in this subsection. The board shall not 15 delegate its discretionary functions resulting in a final 16 decision in: 17 (1) Adopting, amending, or repealing rules; (2) Ordering disciplinary action against a licensee, 18 19 including license revocation or suspension, or the 20 imposition of conditions or fines; provided that

21 <u>summary suspensions may be delegated; or</u>





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1	(3) Granting or denying permits or licenses, including
2	license renewals and reinstatements, or otherwise
3	conditioning permits or licenses, unless the granting,
4	denying, or otherwise conditioning of a permit or
5	license does not require the exercise of the board's
6	expertise and discretion.
7	To delegate authority, the concurrence of a majority of the
8	members to which the board is entitled shall be necessary for
9	any action taken by the board to be valid. The board shall
10	conduct its meetings to delegate powers and duties to its
11	executive director, or other designee, in accordance with
12	chapters 91 and 92."
13	SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
14	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
