A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO LEAF BLOWERS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Noise pollution creates a serious health risk 2 according the World Health Organization. Studies have found 3 that noise causes stress and the body reacts with increased adrenaline, changes in heart rate, and elevated blood pressure. 4 5 This stress has been shown to cause low-weight babies, depressed 6 immunity, aggressive behavior, and greater risk of heart attack. 7 The average leaf blower measures seventy to seventy-five 8 decibels at fifty feet and can reach ninety to one hundred 9 decibels for the operator's ears. The World Health Organization 10 recommends general daytime outdoor noise levels of fifty-five 11 decibels or less. The decibel scale is logarithmic, meaning 12 each increase of ten represents a noise ten times louder. Thus, 13 leaf blowers create a great amount of noise pollution for the 14 operator and the listener, which can have great health risks for 15 all.

However, the noise pollution created by leaf blowers is notthe only source of health risks. The vibrations caused by



carrying a commercial leaf blower on the back of the operator 1 can cause hearing damage. Additionally, the act of stirring up 2 dust and debris increases risks to asthma and allergy sufferers, 3 and increases the risk of breathing pesticides, animal feces, 4 and viruses. A landscaper in Long Island died after using a 5 leaf blower in a place with lots of rodents, because the blower 6 stirred up particles of rodent saliva, urine, and feces 7 containing the hantavirus, which when breathed by humans is 8 9 fatal in most cases.

The legislature finds that the health risks associated with 10 the use of leaf blowers requires stricter limitations on their 11 use. Electric leaf blowers are dramatically quieter than the 12 typical gas-powered leaf blowers, thus limiting usage to 13 electric blowers will reduce the risks associated with noise 14 pollution. However, the legislature hopes that citizens will 15 consider using a rake and broom, which in multiple tests in 16 California has proven to be more effective in cleaning areas and 17 comparable in time used. 18

19 The purpose of this Act is to:

20 (1) Prohibit the use of gas-powered leaf blowers in the
21 State;



1	(2)	Restrict the use of electric leaf blowers within	
2		residential zones to certain hours to reduce	
3		interruptions to people at home;	
4	(3)	Prohibit the use of electric leaf blowers on Sundays	
5		and federal holidays;	
6	(4)	Limit the use of electric leaf blowers to avoid	
7		blowing dust and debris into neighbors' windows or air	
8		duct systems, and onto the property of others; and	
9	(5)	Limit the amount of time one can operate an electric	
10		leaf blower, based on the size of the property.	
11	SECTION 2. Chapter 342F, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
12	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated		
13	and to read as follows:		
14	"§342F- Leaf blower; restrictions. (a) It shall be		
15	unlawful for any person to operate a leaf blower within a		
16	residential zone or within one hundred feet of a residential		
17	zone in the State, except between the hours of 8:00 A.M. and		
18	6:00 P.M.	on any day except Sunday or a federal holiday;	
19	provided that:		
20	(1)	No leaf blower shall be operated within a horizontal	
21		distance of ten feet of any operable window, door, or	
22		mechanical air intake opening or duct of a building;	
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1	(2)	Leaf blowers shall not be operated for more than
2		thirty minutes per day on parcels of less than one-
3		half acre, or for more than one hour per day on
4		parcels of one-half acre or more but less than one
5		acre; or for more than two hours per day on parcels of
6		one acre or more;
7	(3)	No more than one leaf blower may be operated
8		simultaneously per half acre per parcel; and
9	(4)	The maximum decibel level of 70 dba shall not be
10		exceeded.
11	(b)	It shall be unlawful at any time to operate a gas
12	powered m	achine used to blow leaves, dirt, or other debris off
13	sideways,	driveways, lawns, and other surfaces.
14	(c)	It shall be unlawful to operate a leaf blower on
15	Sunday or	any federal holiday.
16	(d)	Violators shall be fined \$50 for the first violation,
17	\$100 for	the second violation, \$200 for the third violation, and
18	\$500 for	each subsequent violation.
19	(e)	For the purposes of this section:
20	"Lea	f blower" means any electric powered machine used to
21	blow leav	es, dirt, or other debris off sidewalks, driveways,
22	lawns, an	d other surfaces.




1 "Parcel" means an area of real property with a separate or 2 distinct number or other designation shown on a plat recorded in 3 the bureau of conveyances for the State. Contiguous parcels owned by the same individual or entity shall be considered one 4 5 parcel for purposes of this section." 6 SECTION 3. Chapter 342H, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 7 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to read as follows: 8 9 "§342H- Leaf blower debris. (a) It shall be unlawful 10 for any person to use or operate a leaf blower in such a manner 11 as to blow, dispel, or make airborne, dust, leaves, grass 12 cuttings, paper, trash, or any other type of unattached debris 13 or material, beyond the boundaries of the parcel of property 14 being cleaned, unless the consent of the adjoining owner or 15 person in possession of the adjoining property is obtained. (b) It shall be unlawful for any person to use or operate 16 17 a leaf blower in such a way as to blow leaves, dirt, and other 18 debris onto the public rights-of-way or onto private property 19 not owned, leased, or controlled by the leaf blower operator or 20 the employer or contractor of the leaf blower operator and to 21 allow the debris to remain there in excess of thirty minutes." 22 SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.
