### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FIREWORKS.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 132D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated 3 and to read as follows: 4 Fireworks surcharge. (a) There is levied and "§132Dassessed a fireworks surcharge, at the wholesale and retail 5 6 levels, on every sale of consumer fireworks made pursuant to 7 this chapter. The fireworks surcharge shall be equal to 8 per cent of the amount collected from the sale. Payment of the 9 surcharge to the State shall be the responsibility of persons 10 licensed under section 132D-7 who sell fireworks. 11 (b) The surcharge shall be proportionally credited to each 12 county fire department to fund the cost of inspecting imported 13 fireworks shipments pursuant to section 132D-8.6(b). Any 14 remaining balance shall be credited to the state general fund. 15 The department of taxation shall prescribe necessary (C)16 forms and may adopt rules pursuant to chapter 91 to administer 17 and effectuate this section."

SECTION 2. Section 132D-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 1 amended by amending the definition of "import" to read as 2 3 follows: "\$132D-2 Definitions. As used in this chapter unless the 4 5 context requires otherwise: "Import" (and any nounal, verbal, adjectival, adverbial, 6 and other equivalent form of the term used interchangeably in 7 this chapter) means to bring or attempt to bring fireworks into 8 the State or to cause fireworks to be brought into the State[-,]9 and includes fireworks samples not intended for resale." 10 11 SECTION 3. Section 132D-8.6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows: 12 The fire department of [a] each county[, in which a 13 "(b) 14 shipment of] shall inspect all incoming shipments with manifests declaring the contents of the shipments as fireworks or articles 15 pyrotechnic [has landed and becomes subject to the jurisdiction 16 of the fire department, shall be allowed to inspect, if it 17 chooses, any shipment declared on the shipping manifest as 18 19 fireworks or articles pyrotechnic]. SECTION 4. Section 132D-14, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 20 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows: 21 "(a) 22 Any person:

6 or a fireworks or articles pyrotechnic related device
7 shall be guilty of a misdemeanor."

8 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed9 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

10 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

**Report Title:** Fireworks

### Description:

Establishes a fireworks surcharge on sales of all consumer fireworks to pay for inspections of incoming fireworks shipments and requires the inspection of all fireworks shipments. Makes the importation of consumer fireworks without a valid license a class C felony. Expands the definition of "import" to include fireworks samples not intended for resale.
