A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FIREWORKS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	PART I
2	SECTION 1. Chapter 132D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
3	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
4	and to read as follows:
5	"§132D- Fireworks surcharge. (a) There is levied and
6	assessed a fireworks surcharge at the wholesale and retail
7	levels on every sale of any aerial device, display fireworks,
8	articles pyrotechnic, or consumer fireworks regulated under this
9	chapter. The fireworks surcharge shall be equal to per cent
10	of the amount collected from the sale. Payment of the surcharge
11	to the State shall be the responsibility of persons licensed
12	under section 132D-7.
13	(b) The department of taxation shall prescribe necessary
14	forms and may adopt rules pursuant to chapter 91 to administer
15	and effectuate this section.
16	(c) This section shall apply to all sales of aerial
17	device, display fireworks, articles pyrotechnic, or consumer

fireworks regulated under this chapter made after June 30, 2010, 1 2 and before November 1, 2011." 3 PART II Section 132D-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 4 SECTION 2. 5 amended by amending the definitions of "consumer fireworks" and 6 "cultural" to read as follows: ""Consumer fireworks" means any fireworks designed 7 primarily for retail sale to the public [during-authorized dates 8 9 and times, | that produces visible or audible effects by 10 combustion, and that is designed to remain on or near the ground and, while stationary or spinning rapidly on or near the ground, 11 emits smoke, a shower of colored sparks, whistling effects, 12 flitter sparks, or balls of colored sparks, and includes 13 combination items that contain one or more of these effects. 14 15 "Consumer fireworks" shall comply with the construction, chemical composition, and labeling regulations of the United 16 State's Consumer Product Safety Commission as set forth in Title 17 16 Code of Federal Regulations and fireworks classified as 18 19 UN0336 and UN0337 by the United States Department of Transportation as set forth in Title 49 Code of Federal 20 "Consumer fireworks" include firework items 21 Regulations. commonly known as firecrackers that are single paper cylinders 22

- 2 fuse and one-quarter of an inch in diameter and contain a charge
- 3 of not more than fifty milligrams of pyrotechnic composition,
- 4 snakes, sparklers, fountains, and cylindrical or cone fountains

- 6 above the ground, illuminating torches, bamboo cannons,
- 7 whistles, toy smoke devices, wheels, and ground spinners that
- 8 when ignited remain within a circle with a radius of twelve feet
- 9 as measured from the point where the item was placed and
- 10 ignited, novelty or trick items, combination items, and other
- 11 fireworks of like construction that are designed to produce the
- 12 same or similar effects."
- ""Cultural" means relating to the arts, customs,
- 14 traditions, mores, and history of all of the various groups of

Section 132D-8, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 9 amended by amending subsection (c) to read as follows: 10 It shall be unlawful for any licensee, other than a 11 wholesaler who is selling or transferring fireworks or articles 12 pyrotechnic to a licensed retailer, to sell or offer to sell, 13 exchange for consideration, give, transfer, or donate any 14 fireworks or articles pyrotechnic at any time to any person who 15 does not present a permit duly issued as required by section 16 132D-10 or 132D-16. The permit shall be signed by the seller or 17 transferor at the time of sale or transfer of the fireworks or 18 articles pyrotechnic, and the seller or transferor shall 19 indicate on the permit the amount and type of fireworks or 20 articles pyrotechnic sold or transferred. No person shall sell 21 or deliver fireworks to any permittee in any amount in excess of 22 the amount specified in the permit, less the amount shown on the SB LRB 10-0799.doc
