A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SALARIES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that existing laws
 authorize the board of education to set the salaries of the
 superintendent of education, the state librarian, deputy
 superintendent, assistant superintendents, and complex area
 superintendents. However, the legislature also finds that the
 board of education's flexibility in setting these salaries is
 restricted by the statutory caps on these salaries.

8 The legislature finds that the salaries of the deputy 9 superintendent, assistant superintendents, and complex area 10 superintendents are capped by statute at a percentage of the 11 superintendent's salary. The legislature further finds that it 12 is a challenge to recruit and fill state and complex area leadership positions because the salaries are not competitive 13 14 with or in the range of the salaries of other administrative 15 leadership positions at the school level. The cap on the 16 superintendent's salary was last established in 2000; the cap on 17 the state librarian's salary was last established in 2001.

1 The legislature finds that repealing the salary caps of the 2 superintendent of education, state librarian, deputy 3 superintendent, assistant superintendent, and complex area 4 superintendent positions will provide the board of education 5 with the authority and latitude to establish these leadership 6 position salaries commensurate with various factors, including 7 the breadth of responsibilities and duties of those positions, and the experience and skills the individuals bring to their 8 9 respective positions. Furthermore, the legislature finds that 10 repealing the salary caps will also provide the board of 11 education with the flexibility it needs to attract and retain 12 individuals to support a strong statewide public education 13 system and statewide public library system.

14 The purpose of this Act is to authorize the board of 15 education, as the appointing body of the superintendent and 16 state librarian, with full flexibility to establish the salaries 17 of the superintendent and the state librarian, as well as the 18 deputy superintendent, assistant superintendents, and complex 19 area superintendents, by repealing the salary caps on these 20 state and complex area leadership positions.

21 SECTION 2. Section 26-52, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
22 amended to read as follows:



1	"§26	-52 Department heads and executive officers. The
2	salaries	of the following state officers shall be as follows:
3	(1)	The salary of the superintendent of education shall be
4		set by the board of education [at a rate no greater
5		than \$150,000 a year];
6	(2)	The salary of the president of the University of
7		Hawaii shall be set by the board of regents;
8	(3)	Effective July 1, 2004, the salaries of all department
9		heads or executive officers of the departments of
10		accounting and general services, agriculture, attorney
11		general, budget and finance, business, economic
12		development, and tourism, commerce and consumer
13		affairs, Hawaiian home lands, health, human resources
14		development, human services, labor and industrial
15		relations, land and natural resources, public safety,
16		taxation, and transportation shall be as last
17		recommended by the executive salary commission.
18		Effective July 1, 2007, and every six years
19		thereafter, the salaries shall be as last recommended
20		by the commission on salaries pursuant to section
21		26-56, unless rejected by the legislature; and



1 (4) The salary of the adjutant general shall be \$85,302 a 2 year. Effective July 1, 2007, and every six years thereafter, the salary of the adjutant general shall 3 4 be as last recommended by the commission on salaries pursuant to section 26-56, unless rejected by the 5 legislature, except that if the state salary is in 6 7 conflict with the pay and allowance fixed by the 8 tables of the regular army or air force of the United 9 States, the latter shall prevail." SECTION 3. Section 302A-621, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 10 amended to read as follows: 11 12 "§302A-621 Salary; deputy superintendent, assistant 13 superintendents, complex area superintendents. The salaries of 14 the deputy superintendent, assistant superintendents, and complex area superintendents shall be set by the board [+ 15 16 provided that the salaries of the deputy superintendent, 17 assistant superintendents, and the complex area superintendents 18 shall not exceed eighty per cent of the superintendent's 19 salarv]." 20 SECTION 4. Section 312-2.1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

21 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:



"(b) The salary of the state librarian shall be set by the
 board of education [at a rate no greater than \$120,000 a year]."
 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

5 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
