A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the Reinventing 2 Education Act of 2004 (Act 51, Session Laws of Hawaii 2004) 3 established a weighted student formula to allocate moneys to schools according to the different costs of educating students 4 5 with different needs. Despite the intended equitable distribution of funds, the legislature finds that the weighted 6 student formula has placed small, remote schools at a 7 disadvantage. In the case of Hana high school and elementary, 8 9 the budgetary shortfall has resulted in the loss of several 10 well-qualified teachers and has threatened the school's ability 11 to offer minimum course requirements for students to earn high 12 school diplomas in 2010. If Hana high school is unable to offer 13 its students the requisite courses for graduation, those 14 students will have to endure a nearly forty-mile, two-hour drive 15 away, to the next closest public high school, King Kekaulike 16 high school.

1 The legislature finds that despite the current economic 2 situation, remote schools should be funded to retain the minimal personnel and resources necessary to graduate students. As of 3 4 2005, six schools were excepted from weighted student formula 5 allocations, receiving instead categorical allotments that 6 quarantee the minimum number of positions and amount of resources to ensure that school operations can continue. 7 The purpose of this Act is to require that funding 8 9 allocations for remote schools be determined by categorical 10 allotments rather than the weighted student formula. SECTION 2. Section 302A-1303.6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, 11 is amended to read as follows: 12 "\$302A-1303.6 Weighted student formula. (a) Based upon 13 14 recommendations from the committee on weights, the board of 15 education, not less than annually, shall adopt a weighted 16 student formula for the allocation of moneys to public schools that takes into account the educational needs of each student. 17 18 -The department, upon the receipt of appropriated moneys, shall use the weighted student formula to allocate funds to public 19 20 schools[-]; provided that a remote school, as defined in subsection (b), and other schools designated by the committee on 21 weights shall not be allocated operating funds using the 22 SB2451 SD2 LRB 10-1932.doc

2	operating funds by categorical allotments that guarantee the
3	funding of a minimum number of instructional positions to ensure
4,	that at least minimum course requirements are maintained.
5	Principals shall expend moneys provided to the principals'
6	schools. This section shall only apply to charter schools for
7	fiscal years in which the charter schools elect to receive
8	pursuant to section 302B-13 [to receive] allocations according
9	to the weighted student formula.
10	(b) For purposes of this section, "remote school" means
11	any public school, as defined in section 302A-101, that is a
12	high school:
13	(1) Located at least a one-hour drive away from the next
14	nearest public high school; or
15	(2) Located on the island of Lanai, Molokai, or Niihau;
16	provided that if a high school is combined with an elementary,
17	middle, intermediate, or other lower level of schooling, that
18	entire school shall be deemed a high school for the purposes of
19	this subsection."
20	SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
21	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
22	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.

Report Title:

Weighted Student Formula; Exception; Remote Schools

Description:

Requires remote schools to be allocated funds using categorical allotments, rather than through the weighted student formula. Defines a remote school as any public school that is a high school located at least a one-hour drive away from the next nearest high school or a high school located on the island of Lanai, Molokai, or Niihau. Effective 7/1/2050.

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
