## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that although motor 2 vehicle rental concessions at Hawaii's public airports 3 contribute over \$30,000,000 a year in concession revenues to 4 support Hawaii's public airports, the legislature in 2008 5 recognized that no facility improvements to those concessions 6 would be made considering other airport priorities as to the use 7 of the funds. Thus, in spite of years of discussions, the 8 facilities over time have deteriorated and have not kept pace 9 with motor vehicle rental facilities and services provided to 10 visitors and residents at other public airports across the 11 United States.

12 As a result, the legislature in 2008 passed Act 226, 13 Session Laws of Hawaii 2008, which established a rental motor 14 vehicle customer facility charge program similar to programs at 15 more than seventy-five other airports across the United States. 16 Act 226 established a rental motor vehicle customer facility 17 charge of \$1 per day. Act 226 also appropriated \$10,000,000 for 18 planning, design, and some improvements. Recognizing the SB2461 SD2 LRB 10-1724.doc 

1 importance of the program to Hawaii's construction industry and 2 economy, the legislature required the department of 3 transportation to provide annual reports and timelines to ensure 4 the "fast-tracking" of the facility projects and services. 5 The department has sought to fast-track the program in 6 keeping with the legislative directive and, with the assistance of planners, designers, and other consultants, has completed 7 8 initial designs and plans for the statewide program. The intent 9 of this Act is to continue the fast-tracking by: 10 (1)Taking the program to the next level by increasing the 11 rental motor vehicle customer facility charge to \$4.50 12 daily as recommended by consultants; and 13 (2)Making further appropriations to support the program, 14 including but not limited to the construction of a 15 \$230,000,000 consolidated-facility at Honolulu 16 international airport and an overflow storage facility 17 at Kahului airport. 18 According to reports prepared by consultants, the increased 19 charge of \$1 daily to \$4.50 daily is expected to fund the

20 planned statewide program with no anticipated future increases.
21 This fee and one-time step up is comparable to similar charges
22 and programs at other airports. Delayed generation of revenues



by stepping up these charges as proposed could likely result in 1 2 the fee rising higher than \$5 daily which must be avoided. 3 The charge of \$4.50 daily and revenues generated will 4 strongly support the program as well as the bonds to finance the 5 related construction projects, which will total about 6 \$500,000,000. To avoid program delays, it is very important 7 that the program have strong financing and a stream of revenues 8 to attract the buyers of the bonds during these turbulent 9 economic times. The one-time-increased charge, as opposed to 10 stepped-up charges, will also result in as much as \$300,000,000 11 saved in finance costs. By fast-tracking the projects, it is 12 anticipated that the program will benefit from about thirty per 13 cent to forty per cent in construction cost savings.

14 As reported by consultants, the increased charge to \$4.50 daily is expected to have no negative impact on rental motor 15 16 vehicles at public airports or on public airport revenues. 17 Other cities and airports have studied similar concerns and the 18 studies have repeatedly found no correlation or negative impact 19 related to an increased charge. In fact, airports generally 20 have seen an increase in revenues since the facilities attract motor vehicle rental companies to conduct their business at the 21 22 airport.

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1 The program does not require visitors and residents to rent a car at a public airport. Individuals will have the 2 opportunity to rent vehicles from off-airport locations and 3 4 thereby avoid having to pay the rental motor vehicle customer 5 facility charge. To minimize the impact to travel agents and 6 others marketing travel packages and quoting prices, this 7 measure delays implementation of the increased rental motor 8 vehicle customer facility charge until September 1, 2010. 9 While the goal of fast-tracking was to start the 10 construction of the Honolulu international airport facility as 11 early as the first quarter of 2010 and thereby provide critical 12 jobs and support for Hawaii's economy, the delay in the 13 imposition and collection of the increased charge to \$4.50 daily 14 has delayed the implementation of this start date as well as any 15 related sale of bonds. Although this Act provides that the department has the discretion to raise and adjust the rental 16 motor vehicle customer facility charge to meet the program's 17 18 goals notwithstanding any law to the contrary, the department recently commented that the law needs to be clarified and that 19 20 it cannot increase charges without proceeding through the rules process, which could take twelve months or longer. 21 The 22 legislature finds that it is preferable that increased charges SB2461 SD2 LRB 10-1724.doc 

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be implemented as of September 1, 2010, to avoid further delays 1 2 to the program. 3 The intent of this Act is to continue the fast-tracking of 4 this program and its projects, thereby providing critical jobs 5 to Hawaii's residents and stimulating Hawaii's suffering economy 6 by: 7 (1)Raising the initial rental motor vehicle customer 8 facility charge, as established by Act 226, Session 9 Laws of Hawaii 2008, from \$1 daily to \$4.50 daily as 10 recommended by consultants, so that the strength of 11 the program can be maintained and the program can 12 benefit from various anticipated costs savings; 13 (2) Raising the initial collection ceiling of the rental 14 motor vehicle customer facility charges from

15 \$10,000,000 to a minimum of \$500,000,000 based upon 16 consultant estimates and reports provided to date; 17 (3) Clarifying that the department can adjust the rental 18 motor vehicle customer facility charge without having 19 to establish rules, as recently reported by the 20 department; and

21 (4) Appropriating \$320,300,000 out of the rental motor
 22 vehicle customer facility charge special fund for the



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1	program for its continued fast-tracking of projects,
2	including the construction of projects at Honolulu
3	international airport and Kahului airport.
4	SECTION 2. Section 261-7, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
5	amended by amending subsection (h) to read as follows:
6	"(h) Notwithstanding any laws to the contrary, the
7	department may establish, levy, assess, and collect rental motor
8	vehicle customer facility charges[ <del>, which</del> ] without the adoption
9	of rules; provided that the department shall conduct a public
10	informational hearing prior to implementing any charges. These
11	charges shall be paid to the department periodically as
12	determined by the department[ <del>. These charges</del> ] and shall be used
13	to pay for, or finance on a long-term basis where appropriate,
14	the design, planning, construction, and other uses of the rental
15	motor vehicle customer facility charges as set forth by the
16	rental motor vehicle customer facility charge special fund in
17	section 261-5.6.
18	The rental motor vehicle customer facility charges shall be
19	levied, assessed, and collected from all rental motor vehicle
20	customers who benefit from the use of any type of rental motor
21	vehicle facility or service provided by the department at a
22	state airport.

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1	Beginning September 1, 2010, the department shall levy,
2	assess, and collect a rental motor vehicle customer facility
3	charge of \$4.50 per day, or any portion of a day that a rental
4	motor vehicle is rented or leased, by a rental motor vehicle
5	concession where customers pick up and return rental vehicles to
6	a facility at a state airport as determined by the director.
7	The \$4.50 per day rental motor vehicle customer facility charge
8	shall not be reduced by the department of transportation for at
9	least twenty years following September 1, 2010, or as necessary
10	to satisfy payment of any bonds issued or financial agreements
11	entered into by the department in furtherance of the purpose of
12	the rental motor vehicle customer facility charge special fund
13	under section 261-5.6.
14	All rental motor vehicle customer facility charges shall be
15	collected by lessors as defined in section 437D-3 and who
16	operate a [ <del>car</del> ] rental <u>motor vehicle</u> concession awarded by the
17	department at a state airport; provided that customers of
18	lessors, as defined in section 437D-3, who do not operate a
19	[car] rental motor vehicle concession at a state airport but
20	whose customers benefit from the use of a $[car]$ rental <u>motor</u>
21	vehicle facility or service at a state airport paid for by
22	rental motor vehicle customer facility charges, shall collect

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1	from [ <del>such car</del> ] rental <u>motor vehicle</u> customers, rental motor
2	vehicle customer facility charges in an amount determined by the
3	department that represents a fair share of the cost and ongoing
4	expenses relating to customer use of [ <del>such a</del> ] <u>the</u> facility or
5	service. All rental motor vehicle customer facility charges
6	collected by [such] the lessor shall be paid to the department.
7	Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, the department may
8	contract the management, maintenance, and operations of the
9	facility and related services with airport concessions or their
10	designee that share in the use of a rental motor vehicle
11	customer facility at a state airport."
12	SECTION 3. Act 226, Session Laws of Hawaii 2008, is
13	amended by repealing section 9.
14	["SECTION 9. Notwithstanding section 7 of this Act, the
15	department of transportation, as of September-1, 2008, shall
16	levy, assess, and collect a rental motor vehicle customer
17	facility charge of \$1 per day, or any portion of a day that a
18	rental motor vehicle is rented or leased, by a rental motor
19	vehicle concession where customers pick up and return rental
20	vehicles to a facility at a state airport as determined by the
21	director. Moneys shall continue to be collected only until such



1	time that the sum of \$25,000,000 is collected and deposited into
2	the rental motor vehicle customer facility charge special fund.
3	The provisions of this section shall not impair, limit, or
4	restrict the department of transportation from levying,
5	assessing, establishing, and collecting rental motor vehicle
6	customer facility charges as set forth in section 7 of this
7	Act."]
8	SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the rental motor
9	vehicle customer facility charge special fund established by
10	section 261-5.6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, the sum of
11	\$320,000,000 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
12	year 2010-2011 for:
13	(1) Planning, design, and temporary relocation of rental
14	motor vehicle operations and related expenses;
15	(2) Construction costs relating to temporary relocation
16	of current rental motor vehicle operations during
17	the construction of a consolidated facility at the
18	Honolulu international airport and related expenses;
19	(3) Planning and design of rental motor vehicle
20	facilities at the Honolulu international airport and
21	related expenses;

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1	(4) Planning, design, and construction of an overflow
2	storage lot at Kahului airport and related expenses;
3	(5) Initial planning and design of consolidated
4	facilities at Kahului airport and related expenses;
5	(6) Statewide development and program management of a
6	motor vehicle rental facilities program and related
7	expenses; and
8	(7) Construction of a consolidated rental motor facility
9	at Honolulu international airport and related
10	expenses.
11	The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department
12	of transportation for the purposes of this Act.
13	SECTION 5. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance of any
14	appropriation made by section 10 of Act 226, Session Laws of
15	Hawaii 2008, as of the close of business on June 30, 2011,
16	shall lapse into the rental motor vehicle customer facility
17	charge special fund.
18	SECTION 6. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
19	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
20	SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2010.
