A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATION TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the furlough
- 2 days negotiated for the 2009-2010 and 2010-2011 school years are
- 3 an unacceptable solution to the budgetary shortfall; although
- 4 other states face similar or worse budgetary situations, Hawaii
- 5 has become the state with the fewest number of days of classroom
- 6 instruction as a result of the furloughs. The legislature
- 7 further finds that establishing a mandatory minimum number of
- 8 days of classroom instruction per school year, which many states
- 9 have already implemented, would raise the standard of quality
- 10 for education and reflect a commitment to quality education for
- 11 Hawaii's children.
- The purpose of this Act is to require all public schools,
- 13 including charter schools, to implement a minimum of two hundred
- 14 days of classroom instruction per school year.
- 15 SECTION 2. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 16 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 17 and to read as follows:

2	<pre>public schools. Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary,</pre>
3	beginning with the 2011-2012 school year, all public schools,
4	including charter schools, shall implement a school calendar
5	that provides not less than two hundred days of classroom
6	instruction per school year. The two hundred days of classroom
7	instruction shall not include state holidays provided by law,
8	professional development days, and other non-instructional days
9	negotiated pursuant to chapter 89."
10	SECTION 3. Chapter 302B, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
11	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
12	and to read as follows:
13	"§302B- Minimum number of classroom instruction days;
14	charter schools. Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary,
15	beginning with the 2011-2012 school year, all charter schools
16	shall implement a school calendar that provides not less than
17	two hundred days of classroom instruction per school year. The
18	two hundred days of classroom instruction shall not include
19	state holidays provided by law, professional development days,
20	and other non-instructional days negotiated pursuant to chapter
21	89 or section 302B-9."

- 1 SECTION 4. Chapter 89, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended
- 2 by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to
- 3 read as follows:
- 4 Minimum number of classroom instructional days.
- 5 Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary, no collective
- 6 bargaining agreement shall contain provisions that would shorten
- 7 the school year for public school employees to less than two
- 8 hundred days of classroom instruction per school year, beginning
- 9 with the 2011-2012 school year."
- 10 SECTION 5. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 11 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 12 begun before its effective date.
- 13 SECTION 6. New statutory material is underscored.
- **14** SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
