# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HISTORIC PRESERVATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 6E-5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
amended to read as follows:

3 "[4] §6E-5[4] State historic preservation officer. (a) The [governor shall appoint a] state historic preservation 4 5 officer[, and may appoint the officer] shall be appointed by the governor from a list of not less than three nominees submitted 6 by the board of land and natural resources and may be appointed 7 without regard to chapter 76[, who]. In developing the list of 8 9 nominees, the board shall consult with appropriate Native Hawaiian and historic preservation organizations. 10 Nominees for state historic preservation officer shall 11 (b) meet the United States Secretary of the Interior standards for 12 13 historic preservation professionals in history, archaeology,

14 architecture, architectural history or a closely related field

15 such as Hawaiian studies, cultural resources management,

16 planning, environmental studies, or historic preservation, or a 17 closely related field.

3	(1)	Working knowledge of the National Historic

7	(2)	Broad knowledge of the national and state historic
8		preservation program and the roles of the federal,
9		state, and local governments, private organizations,

14		preservation requirements and other agency needs;

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#### Report Title:

State Historic Preservation Officer

### Description:

Amends law to require that the state historic preservation officer be appointed from a list of at least three nominees submitted by the board of land and natural resources; requires that the list of nominees be developed in consultation with the appropriate Native Hawaiian and historic preservation organizations; establishes qualifications of the officer that meet those of the Secretary of Interior; effective 7/1/2040. (SD1)

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
