A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO INSURANCE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	PART I
2	SECTION 1. Section 87A-16, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
3	amended to read as follows:
4	"[4]§87A-16[4] Health benefits plan; carriers. (a) The
5	board shall establish the health benefits plan or plans, which
6	shall be exempt from the minimum group requirements of chapter
7	431.
,8	(b) The board may contract for health benefits plans or
9	provide health benefits through a noninsured schedule of
10	benefits.
11	(c) Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, the board
12	shall, during open enrollment and other enrollment periods,
13	offer an employee-beneficiary or dependent-beneficiary eligible
14	for enrollment and currently enrolled in a health benefits plan
15	established under this section, coverage for prescription drug
16	benefits that is identical to the coverage provided under the
17	employee-beneficiary's or dependent-beneficiary's current plan.

T	For the purposes of the subsection:
2	"Coverage" means the benefits, costs, and requirements for
3	patient access to medical products and services as enumerated in
4	the written explanation of benefits document issued by the
5	health carrier.
6	"Identical" means the exact benefit as provided in the
7	written explanation of benefits document issued by the health
8	carrier.
9	"Prescription drug benefits" means the prescription drug
10	benefits as defined in the explanation of benefits document
11	issued by the health insurance carrier that describes the cost,
12	cost-sharing, and available medications, as well as any
13	utilization management requirements that patients must meet to
14	access the prescribed drug."
15	PART II
16	SECTION 2. The purpose of this part is to improve access
17	to the full range of health care services to Medicaid and QUEST
18	members, by ensuring that Medicaid and QUEST health plans have
19	the flexibility to provide appropriate health services via
20	technological means such as telehealth.

1	SECTION 3. Chapter 346, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3	and to read as follows:
4	"§346- Telehealth services; Medicaid and QUEST. The
5	department shall not require:
6	(1) The department's approval for a health plan under the
7	department's Medicaid or QUEST programs to deliver
8	services using a telehealth service; or
9	(2) In-person visits to qualify any telehealth service for
10	coverage under the department's Medicaid or QUEST
11	programs.
12	For the purposes of this section, "telehealth" means the use of
13	telecommunications services, as defined in section 269-1,
14 .	including but not limited to real-time video conferencing-based
15	communication, secure interactive and non-interactive web-based
16	communication, and secure asynchronous information exchange, to
17	transmit patient medical information, including diagnostic-
18	quality digital images and laboratory results for medical
19	interpretation and diagnosis, for the purpose of delivering
20	enhanced health care services and information to parties
21	separated by distance. A standard telephone contact, facsimile
22	transmission, or an email text, in combination or by itself,

- 1 does not constitute a telehealth service for the purposes of
- 2 this section."
- 3 SECTION 4. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 4 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 5 begun before its effective date.
- 6 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 7 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 8 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2020;
- 9 provided that the provisions of section 87A-16(c), Hawaii
- 10 Revised Statutes, in section 1 of this Act shall retroactively
- 11 apply to prescription drug plans of employee-beneficiaries and
- 12 dependent-beneficiaries of the employer-union health benefits
- 13 trust fund enrolled in health plans as of the effective date of
- 14 this Act, who enrolled during the open enrollment periods ending
- 15 on:
- 16 (1) For active employees, December 7, 2009; and
- 17 (2) For retirees, November 30, 2009;
- 18 provided further that notwithstanding the close of these open
- 19 enrollment periods, these beneficiaries shall prior to be
- 20 offered the coverage for prescription drug benefits required
- 21 under section 87A-16(c), Hawaii Revised Statutes, in section 1
- 22 of this Act.

Description:

Requires EUTF health benefits plans to allow enrollees to continue the same prescription drug coverage for current enrollees, and applies this provision retroactively to the 2009 EUTF open enrollment period. Prohibits the Department of Human Services from requiring its approval for a Medicaid or QUEST health plan to deliver services through telehealth, and from requiring in-person health care visits to qualify telehealth services for coverage under these health plans. Effective July 1, 2020. (SB2494 HD1)
