A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO AGRICULTURE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. The purpose of this Act is to promote and
2	support a	griculture by, among other things:
3	(1)	Amending section 147-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, by
4		amending the definition of "agricultural commodity";
5	(2)	Establishing the agriculture inspection and
6		certification special fund under the department of
7	•	agriculture;
8	(3)	Transmitting all fees and moneys collected by the
9		department of agriculture pursuant to chapters 144,
10		145, 147, and 150, Hawaii Revised Statutes, and rules
11		adopted pursuant to section 141-4, Hawaii Revised
12		Statutes, to the agriculture inspection and
13		certification special fund;
14	(4)	Allowing the department to enter into agreements with
15		government and private agencies to hire inspectors;
16	(5)	Transferring all moneys and unpaid obligations of the
17		certification services revolving fund on June 30,



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1	2010, to the agriculture inspection and certification
2	special fund; and
3	(6) Repealing the certification services revolving fund.
4	SECTION 2. Chapter 147, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
5	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
6	and read as follows:
7	"§147- Agriculture inspection and certification special
8	fund. (a) There is established within the state treasury the
9	agriculture inspection and certification special fund.
10	(b) The following shall be deposited into the fund:
11	(1) Fees, charges, fines, and penalties designated by law
12	or rule for deposit into the fund;
13	(2) Federal funds received for inspecting, certifying,
14	weighing, classifying, or grading of agricultural
15	commodities to be exported from or shipped within the
16	state;
17	(3) Grants and gifts;
18	(4) Funds received for food safety or food security
19	certification seals;
20	(5) Funds received for promoting safety-certified food
21	suppliers and services related to food safety;



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1	(6)	All interest earned or accrued on moneys deposited in
2		the fund; and
3	(7)	Any other moneys made available to the fund.
4	(c)	The moneys in the agriculture inspection and
5	certifica	tion special fund shall be expended by the department
6	for:	·
7	(1)	The licensure of commission merchants, dealers,
8		brokers, agents, processors, and retail merchants;
9	(2)	The administration, operation, and enforcement of
10		chapter 144, part I of chapter 145, chapter 150, this
11		chapter, and rules adopted pursuant to section 141-4;
12	i	and
13	<u>(3)</u>	The inspection, certification, weighing, or grading of
14		agricultural commodities that are to be imported into,
15		exported from, or shipped within the state.
16	<u>No m</u>	oneys from the general or other special or revolving
17	funds sha	11 be expended by the department for the
18	administr	ation, operation, or enforcement of chapter 144, part I
19	of chapte	r 145, chapter 150, this chapter, or rules adopted
20	pursuant	to section 141-4; provided that the expenditure of
21	moneys fr	om the general fund for central services and
22	departmen	tal administrative expenses shall be permitted. Moneys
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1	in the agriculture inspection and certification special fund
2	shall be expended to cover costs of administering chapter 144,
3	part I of chapter 145, chapter 150, this chapter, and rules
4	adopted pursuant to section 141-4, including the costs of
5	salaries, fringe benefits, operating expenses, equipment, motor
6	vehicles, contracts for services, and promotional expenses."
7	SECTION 3. Section 141-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
8	amended to read as follows:
9	"§141-4 Weights of coffee; rules. The department of
10	agriculture may make rules respecting the weighing of coffee
11	prior to its shipment to points outside the [State,] state, and
12	providing for the certification of weights thereof. Further, a
13	reasonable schedule of fees to defray the expense of
14	administering this section shall be established by the
15	department, which fees shall be collected and [deposited with]
16	transmitted to the state director of finance [to the credit of
17	the general] for deposit into the agricultural inspection and
18	certification special fund; provided that the department shall
19	consult the appropriate industries, organizations, and agencies
20	prior to the promulgation of the rules."
21	SECTION 4. Section 144-5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

22 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:



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1 "(a) There shall be paid to the department for all feeds 2 distributed or imported for use or sale in this [State,] state, 3 inspection fees as established by the rules of the department; 4 provided that the department shall exempt by rule the payment of 5 inspection fees on feed not subject to specific requirements of 6 this chapter or rules adopted under this chapter. All 7 inspection fees collected shall be [deposited with] transmitted 8 to the state director of finance [to the credit of the general] 9 for deposit into the agricultural inspection and certification 10 special fund." 11 SECTION 5. Section 145-14, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 12 amended to read as follows: 13 "§145-14 Disposition of fees and charges. (a) All fees, 14 charges, expenses, and other moneys collected pursuant to this 15 [chapter] part shall be [deposited-with] transmitted to the 16 state director of finance [to the credit of the general] for 17 deposit into the agriculture inspection and certification 18 special fund. 19 (b) The following moneys shall be deposited into the 20 agriculture inspection and certification special fund: 21 Fees, charges, expenses, and other moneys collected (1) 22 under this part;



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1	(2) Fines collected from violations of this part;
2	(3) Interest earned on the moneys in the special fund; and
3	(4) All other moneys made available to the fund."
4	SECTION 6. Section 147-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
5	amended by amending the definition of "agricultural commodity"
6	to read as follows:
7	""Agricultural commodity" means fresh fruits and fresh
8	vegetables of every kind and character, whether or not frozen or
9	packed in ice, whether produced in the [State] state or
10	imported, nuts, and coffee, whether cherry or parchment, or
11	green beans, which have been produced in the [State, and] state,
12	raw unprocessed honey, whether produced in the [State] state or
13	imported $[,]$, milk which has been produced in the state, poultry
14	eggs or poultry carcass or meat which has been produced in the
15	state, and any live animal included in section 142-49 or the
16	carcass or meat of these animals, whether produced in the state
17	or imported except the carcass or meat of horses or llamas."
18	SECTION 7. Section 147-10, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
19	amended to read as follows:
20	"§147-10 Income from certification and agriculture control
21	activities. [Except for fees collected by the department
22	pursuant to part VII, all] All fees, expenses, and penalties
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1 collected by the department pursuant to this part shall be 2 [deposited with] transmitted to the director of finance [to the 3 credit of the general] for deposit into the agriculture 4 inspection and certification special fund." SECTION 8. Section 147-34, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 5 amended to read as follows: 6 7 "§147-34 Inspection; certification fees. The board of 8 agriculture may designate any appropriately-certified employee 9 or agent of the department as an inspector to classify and 10 inspect fresh and processed flowers and foliage for quality and 11 condition and to determine if containers, packing materials, and 12 methods of packing meet the minimum requirements established. 13 In addition the inspector may classify and inspect flowers and 14 foliage for quality and condition at the request of persons 15 having a financial interest in the commodities [in order] to 16 ascertain and to certify to those persons the grade, 17 classification, quality, or condition thereof and other 18 pertinent facts. The department may fix, assess, and collect or 19 cause to be collected fees for those certification services when 20 they are performed by the employees of the department. The fees 21 shall be on a uniform basis and in an amount reasonably 22 necessary to cover the cost of certification services provided SB2527 HD1 HMS 2010-2726

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1 at the request of persons having a financial interest. [Except 2 for fees collected by the department pursuant to part-VII, all] 3 All fees collected by the department pursuant to this part shall 4 be [deposited with] transmitted to the [state] director of 5 finance [to the credit of the general] for deposit into the 6 agriculture inspection and certification special fund." 7 SECTION 9. Section 147-64, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 8 amended to read as follows: 9 "§147-64 Deposit of moneys. [Except for fees collected by 10 the department pursuant to part VII, all All fees, charges, 11 expenses, civil penalties, and other moneys collected by the 12 department under this part or any rules prescribed by the 13 department pursuant to this part shall be [deposited with] 14 transmitted to the [state] director of finance [to the credit of 15 the general] for deposit into the agriculture inspection and 16 certification special fund." 17 SECTION 10. Section 147-74, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 18 amended to read as follows: 19 "§147-74 Grading standards and regulations [.]; fees. (a) 20 Subject to chapter 91, the department of agriculture may make 21 rules with respect to:

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1	(1)	Sale and transportation for sale of eggs for human
2		consumption;
3	(2)	Specific grades or standards of quality, condition and
4		size or weight classes which shall conform when
5		practical to those established by the United States
6		Department of Agriculture as local conditions will
7		permit;
8	(3)	Inspection and classification;
9	(4)	Assessment and collection of fees for requested
10		certification as to grade, standard of quality,
11		condition, and size of weight classes;
12	(5)	Labeling of containers of imported and locally produced
13		eggs and marking of individual imported eggs as to
14		origin;
15	(6)	Seller's invoice for sale of eggs;
16	(7)	Records of imported shell eggs of foreign origin;
17	(8)	Methods of determining egg quality, which shall not
18		include recandling or any other method applied to eggs
19		in interstate commerce which is discriminatory or
20		impairs that commerce in any way or requires a cost
21		increase of eggs in interstate commerce; and



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1	(9) Enforcement of this part and of the rules adopted under	
2	this part.	
3	(b) Any fees collected pursuant to subsection (a) (4) shall	
4	be transmitted to the director of finance for deposit into the	
5	agriculture inspection and certification special fund."	
6	SECTION 11. Section 147-97, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
7	amended to read as follows:	
8	"§147-97 Disposition of fees. All fees collected under	
9	this part shall be [paid into-a special fund established by the	
10	department of agriculture and shall be expended for the purposes	
11	of this part.] transmitted to the director of finance for	
12	deposit into the agriculture inspection and certification	
13	special fund."	
14	SECTION 12. Section 147-102, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
15	amended to read as follows:	
16	"[4] §147-102[4] Certification and audit services. The	
17	department of agriculture shall fix, assess, and collect fees	
18	for certification or audit services provided by temporary	
19	inspectors employed under this [part;.] chapter. The fees shall	
20	be in amounts necessary to cover all costs of the administration	
21	and provision of the certification or audit services provided	
22	under this [part;] <u>chapter;</u> provided that the department of	
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1	agriculture shall establish charges for traveling expenses and
2	extraordinary services when the performance of the services
3	involves unusual cost. The fees and charges established by the
4	department of agriculture shall not be subject to chapter 91[-]
5	and, upon collection, shall be transmitted to the director of
6	finance for deposit into the agriculture inspection and
7	certification special fund. The department of agriculture may
8	employ temporary inspectors to assist in providing certification
9	or audit service under parts I, III, IV, VIII, and IX, and those
10	temporary inspectors shall be exempt from chapter 76."
11	SECTION 13. Section 147-112, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
12	amended to read as follows:
13	"[+]§147-112[+] Cooperative agreements and contracts to
14	provide auditing and certification services. The department may
15	enter into cooperative agreements with the United States
16	Department of Agriculture or other agreements and contracts with
17	private parties or other governmental agencies for the purposes
18	of:
19	(1) Auditing and certifying that applicants are following
20	good agricultural handling, processing, and
21	manufacturing practices; [and]



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1	(2) Hiring and paying travel and other expenses for
2	inspectors to perform the certification and audit
3	services required under this chapter;
4	[(2)] <u>(3)</u> Maintaining food <u>safety</u> , security, and product
5	<pre>traceability[-]; and</pre>
6	(4) Establishing and maintaining an Internet food safety
7	promotional and reporting system."
8	SECTION 14. Section 147-114, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
9	amended to read as follows:
10	"[+]§147-114[+] Fees and deposit of moneys. (a) The
11	department shall fix, assess, and collect fees for the audit and
12	certification services provided under this part[\cdot], including
13	fees for hiring inspectors to perform the services. The fees
14	shall be as established under cooperative agreement with the
15	United States Department of Agriculture or other governmental
16	agencies or, if not applicable, as established by rule under
17	section 147-7. The department [may] shall also charge an amount
18	necessary to cover all costs of traveling expenses and
19	extraordinary services when the performance of the services
20	involves unusual cost in their performance.
21	(b) [Except for fees collected by the department-pursuant
22	to part VII, all] All fees and expenses collected by the



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1	department pursuant to this part shall be [deposited with]
2	transmitted to the director of finance [to the credit of the
3	general] for deposit into the agriculture inspection and
4	certification special fund."
5	SECTION 15. Section 147-126, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
6	amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:
7	"(b) [Except-for fees collected by the department-pursuant
8	to part VII, all] All fees and expenses collected by the
9	department pursuant to this part shall be [deposited with]
10	transmitted to the director of finance [to-the credit of the
11	general] for deposit into the agriculture inspection and
12	certification special fund."
13	SECTION 16. Section 147-101, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
14	repealed.
15	[" \$147-101 Certification services revolving fund. There
16	is established a certification services revolving fund for use
17	by the department of agriculture-to-support certification or
18	audit services established-under parts-I, III, IV, VIII, and IX.
19	Moneys in the fund may be expended for materials, salaries,
20	equipment, training, travel, and other costs related to
21	providing certification or audit services. Notwithstanding
22	section 147-10, 147-34, 147-64, 147-114-and 147-126, moneys
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1	derived from the certification or audit services provided by
2	temporary inspectors employed under this part or from charges
3	for-traveling expenses or extraordinary-services-shall-be
4	deposited into the fund."]
5	SECTION 17. (a) The repeal of section 147-101, Hawaii
6	Revised Statutes, shall not rescind any fees authorized or
7	imposed under that section that would have been deposited into
8	the certification services revolving fund. From July 1, 2010,
9	the fees under those sections shall be deposited into the
10	agriculture inspection and certification special fund.
11	(b) On the effective date of this Act:
12	(1) All moneys in the certification services revolving fund
13	on June 30, 2010, shall be transferred to the
14	agriculture inspection and certification special fund;
15	(2) All unpaid obligations of the certification services
16	revolving fund on June 30, 2010, shall become payable
17	from the agriculture inspection and certification
18	special fund; and
19	(3) The certification services revolving fund shall cease
20	to exist.
21	SECTION 18. (a) Between July 1, 2020, and September 30,
22	2010, the department of agriculture shall adopt new or amend
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1 existing rules to impose or increase fees authorized to be 2 charged under section 141-4, chapter 144, part I of chapter 145, 3 chapter 150, chapter 147, Hawaii Revised Statutes, and rules 4 adopted pursuant to section 141-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, 5 without regard to the public notice and public hearing requirements of section 91-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, the small 6 7 business impact review requirements or chapter 201M, Hawaii 8 Revised Statutes or the limit on fee increases under section 92-9 28, Hawaii Revised Statutes. The department shall set the fees 10 through a two-tiered increase at amounts intended to generate 11 sufficient revenues to pay the operation and maintenance costs 12 of implementing the agriculture inspection and certification 13 programs of chapter 141, chapter 144, part I of chapter 145, 14 chapter 147, chapter 150, Hawaii Revised Statutes, and rules 15 adopted pursuant to section 141-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, and 16 central services and departmental administrative expense 17 assessments of section 36-27 and section 36-30, Hawaii Revised 18 Statutes.

(b) If, by September 30, 2010, the department of
agriculture has not complied with subsection (a), then the fee
charged for each inspection or certification conducted under
authority of section 141-4, chapter 144, part I of chapter 145, SB2527 HD1 HMS 2010-2726



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1 chapter 147, chapter 150, Hawaii Revised Statutes, and rules 2 adopted pursuant to section 141-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, 3 shall be \$65 per hour or as established under cooperative 4 agreement with the United States Department of Agriculture or 5 other governmental agencies commencing October 1, 2010, and the 6 fee charged for licensure of or license renewal for a commission 7 merchant, dealer, broker, agent, processor, or retail merchant 8 shall be: 9 (1) \$80 for commission merchant, dealer, broker, agent, or 10 processor; 11 (2) \$20 for a retail merchant, and (3) \$10 for each branch store; 12 13 commencing October 1, 2010. 14 (c) Any subsequent amendments to the rules adopted or 15 amended pursuant to subsection (a) or the fee established under subsection (b) shall be subject to all applicable provisions of 16 17 chapter 91, chapter 201M, and section 92-28, Hawaii Revised 18 Statutes. 19 SECTION 19. 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1 inspection and certification special fund to cover the costs of 2 the agriculture inspection and certification program of the 3 department of agriculture; provided that funding shall cease 4 when the collection into the agriculture inspection and 5 certification special fund becomes sufficient to carry out the 6 purposes of this Act.

7 There is appropriated out of the agriculture inspection and 8 certification special fund established by chapter 147, Hawaii 9 Revised Statutes, the sum of \$ for fiscal year 2010-10 2011 for the purposes of the agricultural inspection and 11 certification program. The sum appropriated shall be expended 12 by the department of agriculture for the purposes of this Act. 13 SECTION 20. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed and stricken. New statutory material is underscored. 14 15 SECTION 21. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2020.



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Report Title:

Agricultural Commodity; Inspection and Certification

Description:

Amends the definition of "agricultural commodity" to include milk, eggs, poultry, and livestock of the bovine, swine, sheep, or goat species and the carcasses or meat of those species. Establishes the Agriculture Inspection and Certification Special Fund under the Department of Agriculture for the inspection, certification, weighing, or grading of agricultural commodities that are to be imported into, exported from, or shipped within the state. Deposits all fees, civil penalties, and other moneys collected by DOA into the Special Fund. Allows DOA to enter into agreements with government and private agencies to hire and pay inspectors to perform certification and audit services, maintain food safety, and establish and maintain an Internet food safety promotional and reporting system. Repeals the Certification Services Revolving Fund. Requires the establishment or increase of certain fees to cover the operation and maintenance costs of agriculture inspection and certification programs, and central services and departmental administrative expense assessments. Appropriates funds for DOA's agriculture inspection and certification program. Effective July 1, 2020. (SB2527 HD1)
