## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TECHNOLOGY.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. (a) Through Act 2 of the First Special Session
2	of 2007, the legislature created the Hawaii broadband task force
3	to provide recommendations on how to advance Hawaii's broadband
4	capabilities and use. The legislature finds that advanced
5	broadband services are essential infrastructure for an
6	innovation economy and a knowledge society in the twenty-first
7	century. High-speed broadband services at affordable prices are
8	essential for the advancement of education, health, public
9	safety, research and innovation, civic participation,
10	e-government, economic development and diversification, and
11	public safety and services. The legislature also recognizes the
12	evolution in the manner in which communications and information
13	services are delivered to the consumer, including by wireline,
14	wireless, cable television, and satellite infrastructures, and
15	that the voice, video, and data services provided over these
16	infrastructures are converging.

1	Meet	ing the following goals is critical if Hawaii is to
2	compete s	uccessfully in the global economy of the twenty-first
3	century:	
4	(1)	Ensure access to broadband communications to all
5		households, businesses, and organizations throughout
6		Hawaii by 2012 at speeds and prices comparable to the
7		average speeds and prices available in the top three
8		performing countries in the world;
9	(2)	Increase availability of advanced broadband
10		communications service on a competitive basis to
11		reduce prices, increase service penetration, and
12		improve service to all persons in Hawaii;
13	(3)	Increase broadband availability at affordable costs to
14		low-income and other disadvantaged groups, including
15		by making low-cost, broadband-capable computers
16		available to eligible recipients;
17	(4)	Increase sharing of the infrastructure used to deploy
18		broadband in order to speed up implementation, reduce
19		costs to providers, reduce underlying costs to
20		providers through incentives rather than eminent
21		domain procedures, ease deployment of broadband, and
22		ease entry into a competitive broadband marketplace;

1	(5)	Increase flexible, timely, and responsible access to
2		public rights-of-way and public facilities for
3		broadband service providers; and
4	(6)	Develop a more streamlined permit approval process
5		that reduces the time and cost of infrastructure
6		deployment, to be created jointly by disparate
7		permitting agencies, stakeholders, and other
8		interested parties.
9	(b)	The purpose of this Act is to begin implementation of
10	activitie	s to achieve these goals by:
11	(1)	Adding the functions of telework promotion and
12		broadband assistance to the department of commerce and
13		consumer affairs responsibilities over cable
14		programming under chapter 440G, Hawaii Revised
15		Statutes;
16	(2)	Establishing a telework promotion and broadband
17		assistance advisory council to meet the goals of
18		expended digital cable programming and services in the
19		State of Hawaii;
20	(3)	Establishing a work group to develop procedures for
21		streamlined permitting functions applicable to the

development of broadband services or technology; and

1	(4)	Requiring the department of commerce and consumer
2		affairs to report annually to the legislature on all
3		expenditures of federal moneys received pursuant to
4		the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 or
5		other federal funds, for purchasing broadband
6		facilities, services, or equipment, or entering into
7		contracts for broadband-related projects.
8	SECT	ION 2. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by
9	adding tw	o new sections to chapter 440G to be appropriately
10	designate	d and to read as follows:

3	(3)	Support the efforts of both public and private
4		entities in Hawaii to enhance or facilitate the
5		deployment of, and access to competitively priced,
6		advanced electronic communications services, including
7		digital cable programming and services, and internet
8		access services of general application throughout
9		Hawaii;
10	(4)	Make recommendations to establish affordable,
11		accessible broadband services to unserved areas of
12		Hawaii and monitor advancements in communication that
13		will facilitate this goal;
14	(5)	Advocate for, and facilitate the development and
15		deployment of, expanded digital cable programming and
16		applications, programs, and services including, but
17		not limited to telework, telemedicine, and e-learning
18		that will bolster the usage of and demand for
19		broadband level telecommunications; and
20	<u>(6)</u>	Serve as a broadband information and applications
21		clearinghouse for the State and a coordination point

3	The director shall submit an annual report to the
4	legislature on the department's efforts to utilize digital cable
5	programming and services to develop and expand telework
6	initiatives, including telework participation levels and trends
7	of both private and public sector employees in Hawaii.
8	§440G-B Telework promotion and broadband assistance
9	advisory council; purpose; membership; compensation;
10	chairperson. (a) There is established within the department of
11	commerce and consumer affairs for administrative purposes, the
12	broadband advisory council to advise on policy and funding
13	priorities to promote and encourage use of telework alternatives
14	for public and private employees, and expedite deployment of
15	affordable and accessible broadband services in Hawaii.
16	(b) The council shall be composed of thirteen members
17	appointed by the governor, as provided in section 26-34, except

19	(1) Two members of the senate, appointed by the president

7		technology, telecommunications, and investment
8		industries, including the incumbent cable provider.
9	All membe	rs shall serve for a term of four years. Any vacancies
10	occurring	in the membership of the advisory council shall be
11	filled fo	r the remainder of the unexpired term in the same
12	manner as	the original appointments.
13	<u>(c)</u>	The members of the advisory council shall select the
14	chairpers	on of the advisory council and shall meet at times as
15	may be ca	lled by the chairperson or a majority of the advisory
16	council.	Members shall be reimbursed for reasonable expenses,
17	including	travel expenses, necessary for the performance of
18	their dut	ies. Administrative support to the advisory council
19	shall be	provided by the department of commerce and consumer

1 the use or development of broadband service or broadband 2 technology. The procedures shall be consistent across all 3 counties and shall provide that any permitting fees and revenues 4 traditionally accruing to the counties that relate to the use or 5 development of broadband service or broadband technology will 6 continue to accrue to the counties once the procedures go into 7 effect. 8 SECTION 4. The department of commerce and consumer affairs 9 shall report annually to the legislature on the receipt and **10** expenditure of federal moneys from the American Recovery and 11 Reinvestment Act of 2009, and moneys from other federal **12** appropriation measures or applicable federal acts, for the 13 purposes of purchasing broadband facilities, services, or 14 equipment, or for entering into contracts for broadband-related 15 projects by all state agencies for all state agencies approval. 16 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon approval.

Technology; Telework Promotion and Broadband Assistance; Advisory Council; Federal Moneys

## Description:

Requires the director of commerce and consumer affairs, in conjunction with expanded digital cable programming and services, promote and encourage telework; establishes a telework promotion and broadband assistance advisory council; establishes a work group to develop procedures for streamlined permitting functions applicable to development of broadband services or technology; requires department of commerce and consumer affairs to report annually to the legislature on expenditures of federal moneys for broadband facilities, services, equipment, or contracts.
