## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE HAWAII CIVIL RIGHTS COMMISSION.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Act 30, Special
- 2 Session Laws of Hawaii 2009, requires the Hawaii civil rights
- 3 commission to adopt administrative rules to conform state law
- 4 protections against disability discrimination to the federal
- 5 Americans with Disabilities Act Amendments Act of 2008 (ADAAA).
- 6 Through Act 30, the legislature directed the Hawaii civil rights
- 7 commission to complete this rulemaking process no later than
- 8 December 31, 2010.
- 9 The legislature finds that the United States Equal
- 10 Employment Opportunities Commission (EEOC), the agency
- 11 authorized to promulgate federal regulations implementing the
- 12 ADAAA, has not completed its rulemaking process and is unlikely
- 13 to do so before July 2010. The purpose of this Act is to extend
- 14 the deadline for the Hawaii civil rights commission to complete
- 15 its rulemaking process to allow the commission to review and
- 16 conform state law protections against disability discrimination
- 17 to the final EEOC administrative regulation guidelines.

- 1 SECTION 2. Act 30, Special Session Laws of Hawaii 2009, is
- 2 amended by amending section 3 to read as follows:
- 3 "SECTION 3. The Hawaii civil rights commission shall
- 4 complete the rulemaking process for purposes of section 2 of
- 5 this Act no later than December 31, [2010.] 2011."
- 6 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 7 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 8 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
