A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE BOARD OF EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that significant changes 2 to the public education system, including clearer accountability 3 for the performance, administration, and progress of the public 4 education system, are needed to improve the quality of education 5 and student achievement. The legislature further finds that changing the process of selecting all members of the board of 6 7 education by election to a combination of election and 8 appointments by the governor makes the board members more 9 accountable to the governor while still allowing representatives 10 of various geographic areas to elect members of the board of 11 education.

12 The purpose of this Act is to change the method of 13 selection of board of education members from election to a 14 combination of election and appointment by the governor, with 15 the advice and consent of the senate, from pools of qualified 16 candidates presented to the governor by a newly established 17 board of education candidate nomination commission.



SECTION 2. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 1 2 amended by adding eight new sections to part IV to be 3 appropriately designated and to read as follows: "§302A-A Board of education; elected and appointed 4 members, nonvoting members. (a) Pursuant to section 13-1, the 5 board of education shall consist of thirteen voting members. 6 Five of the voting members of the board of education shall be 7 8 elected according to section 13-1(a), and eight voting members 9 of the board of education shall be appointed by the governor, 10 with the advice and consent of the senate, from pools of gualified candidates presented to the governor by the board of 11 education candidate nomination commission established under 12 13 section 302A-F. 14 The Hawaii state student council shall select a public (b) high school student to serve as a nonvoting member on the board 15 16 of education. (c) The board shall invite the senior military commander 17 in Hawaii to appoint a nonvoting military representative to the 18 board, who shall serve for a two-year term without compensation. 19 As the liaison to the board, the military representative shall 20 21 advise the board regarding state education policies and 22 departmental actions affecting students who are enrolled in 2010-0409 SB SMA.doc

16	apportion	ment plan, the chief election officer, by proclamation
17	issued no	later than the tenth day prior to the close of filing
18	in electi	ons, shall designate the representative districts that
19	comprise	the departmental school districts to comply with the
20	new distr	icting scheme of such plan; provided that the
21	departmen	tal school districts designated shall cover areas
22	similar t	o those described in section 302A-B.



1	§302A-D Board members; eligibility. No member of the
2	board appointed pursuant to section 302A-A shall hold or be a
3	candidate for any other public office under the state or county
4	governments; nor shall a person be eligible for appointment,
5	pursuant to section 302A-A, to the board of education if that
6	person is also a candidate for any other public office under the
7	state or county government. The term "public office", for the
8	purposes of this section, shall not include notaries public,
9	reserve police officers, or officers of emergency organizations
10	for civilian defense or disaster relief.
11	§302A-E Board members; terms, vacancies. (a) Pursuant to
12	section 26-34, the term of office of appointed members of the
13	board shall be four years and shall commence on July 1 and
14	expire on June 30. The term of office of elected members of the
15	board shall be four years and shall commence on the date
16	provided in section 13-4.
17	(b) Any vacancy of a board member appointed pursuant to
18	section 302A-A that may occur through any cause other than the
19	expiration of the term of office shall be filled in accordance
20	with section 302A-F. Any vacancy of a board member elected
21	pursuant to chapter 13 that may occur through any cause other



1	than the expiration of the term of office shall be filled in
2	accordance with section 17-6.
3	§302A-F Board of education candidate nomination
4	commission; establishment, duties. (a) There is established
5	the board of education candidate nomination commission to
6	present to the governor pools of qualified candidates from which
7	the members of the board of education shall be nominated and
8	appointed by the governor with the advice and consent of the
9	senate. The candidate nomination commission shall establish the
10	criteria for qualifying, screening, and presenting to the
11	governor candidates for membership on the board of education.
12	The candidate nomination commission shall be attached to the
13	department of education for administrative purposes.
14	(b) Except as provided in subsection (c), within sixty
15	days of convening its first meeting, the candidate nomination
16	commission shall present no fewer than two and no more than four
17	qualified candidates to the governor for each vacant seat on the
18	board of education that has arisen due to resignation, death, or
19	removal by the governor; provided that for all subsequent
20	presentations to the governor, the candidate nomination
21	commission shall present no fewer than two and no more than four



1	<u>candidate</u>	s for each seat on the board of education to the
2	governor	within:
3	(1)	Thirty days of a vacancy that arises by resignation,
4		death, or removal by the governor; or
5	(2)	One hundred twenty days prior to the expiration of a

10		criteria to be applied and a description of the

17		responsibilities of a member of the board of
18		education;
19	(3)	Publicly advertise pending vacancies and actively
20		solicit and accept applications from potential
21		candidates;



1	(4)	Develop and implement a fair, independent, and
2		nonpartisan procedure for selecting candidates to
3		serve on the board of education; and
4	(5)	Require each candidate to disclose any existing or
5		anticipated contracts with the department of education
6		or any existing or anticipated financial transactions
7		with the department of education.
8	Upon subm	ission to the governor, presentations of the candidate
9	nominatio	n commission shall be made available to the public by
10	the depar	tment of education.
11	(d)	For each board seat to be filled, the governor shall
12	select on	e nominee from among the candidate nomination
13	commissio	n's presentation within days of the presentation.
14	(e)	Notwithstanding chapter 92F or any other law to the
15	contrary,	all information required by the board of education
16	candidate	nomination commission shall be confidential, including
17	without 1	imitation, all information obtained, reviewed, or
18	considere	d before and after commission decision-making.
19	Confident	ial candidate nomination commission information shall
20	include d	locuments, data, or other information that is not of
21	public re	cord, including without limitation, personal financial
22	informati	on; the names of applicants; applications and the
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1	personal,	financial, and other information contained therein
2	submitted	by the applicants to the candidate nomination
3	commissio	n; interviews; schedules; reports; studies; background
4	checks; c	redit reports; surveys and reports prepared for or on
5	the candi	date nomination commission's behalf; the results of any
6	evaluatio:	ns or assessments conducted by the candidate nomination
7	commissio	n; the substance and details of any discussions with
8	candidate	nomination commission members; and the substance and
9	details o	f discussions and deliberations of the candidate
10	nominatio	n commission and any of its committees during meetings.
11	302A	-G Board of education candidate nomination commission;
12	members,	terms, vacancies. (a) The candidate nomination
13	commissio	n shall consist of seven members to be appointed
14	without r	egard to section 26-34 as follows:
15	(1)	One member shall be appointed by the president of the
16		senate;
17	(2)	One member shall be appointed by the speaker of the
18		house of representatives;
19	(3)	One member shall be appointed by the governor;
20	(4)	One member shall be appointed by the Hawaii State
21		Teachers Association;



1	(5)	One member shall be appointed by the Hawaii P-20
2		council;
3	(6)	One member shall be the president of a school
4		community council appointed by the superintendent of
5		education; and
6	(7)	One member shall be appointed by the chairperson of
7		the executive council of the Hawaii state student
8		council.
9	(b)	Members of the candidate nomination commission shall
10	be select	ed in a wholly nonpartisan manner. If any member has
11	not been	appointed within one hundred eighty days of the
12	effective	date of Act , Session Laws of Hawaii 2010, the
13	sitting m	embers on the candidate nomination commission shall
14	make an i	nterim appointment to fill the vacant seat. The
15	<u>interim a</u>	ppointee shall satisfy the requirements for appointment
16	provided	in this subsection and shall serve until the time when
17	the appro	priate appointing authority makes an appointment for
18	the vacan	t seat as provided in this subsection. Appointees to
19	the candi	date nomination commission shall have a general
20	understan	ding of the purposes, mission, and responsibilities of
21	the board	of education and the department of education.
22	Appointee	s shall be individuals who are widely viewed as having



1	placed the broad public interest ahead of special interests,
2	having achieved a high level of prominence in their respective
3	professions, and being respected members of the community.
4	(c) Members of the candidate nomination commission shall
5	serve four-year terms; provided that the three members initially
6	appointed by the governor, the president of the senate, and the
7	speaker of the house of representatives shall serve for terms of
8	two years; provided further that terms for appointments of the
9	initial members of the candidate nomination commission shall be
10	deemed to begin on July 1 following the effective date of Act
11	, Session Laws of Hawaii 2010, regardless of the actual
12	date of appointment.
13	(d) Members of the candidate nomination commission shall
14	serve without compensation but shall be reimbursed for expenses,
15	including travel, board, and lodging expenses, necessary for the
16	performance of their duties.
17	(e) The candidate nomination commission shall operate in a
18	wholly nonpartisan manner. No individual, while a member of the
19	candidate nomination commission, shall run for or hold any
20	elected office under the United States or the State or any of
21	its political subdivisions.



1	(f) If a vacancy occurs, a successor shall be appointed in
2	the same manner and subject to the same qualifications as the
3	person's predecessor. The person appointed to fill a vacancy
4	shall serve for the remainder of the term of the person's
5	predecessor.
6	302A-H Board of education candidate nomination commission;
7	meetings. The candidate nomination commission shall convene its
8	first meeting on or after thirty-one days from the effective
9	date of Act , Session Laws of Hawaii 2010; provided that,
10	if thirty days after the effective date of Act , Session
11	Laws of Hawaii 2010, all the members to which the candidate
12	nomination commission is entitled have not yet been appointed,
13	the candidate nomination commission shall convene its first
14	meeting upon the appointment of a majority of its members. The
15	members of the candidate nomination commission shall choose a
16	chairperson from among themselves. A majority of all the
17	members to which the candidate nomination commission is entitled
18	shall constitute a quorum to conduct business. The concurrence
19	of a majority of all the members to which the candidate
20	nomination commission is entitled shall be necessary to make any
21	action of the candidate nomination commission valid. The
22	candidate nomination commission shall meet annually and at other



1	times as necessary. The candidate nomination commission shall
2	be exempt from part I of chapter 92."
3	SECTION 3. Section 13-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
4	amended to read as follows:
5	"§13-1 Board members; number [-], elected and appointed
6	voting members. (a) The board of education shall consist of
7	thirteen voting members [who shall be elected by the registered
8	voters of two at-large school board districts as follows:
9	First school board district: the island of Oahu, comprised
10	of the 11th through the 48th and a portion of the 49th (that
11	portion found on the island of Oahu) representative districts,
12	and the
13	Second school board district: the islands of Hawaii, Maui,
14	Lanai, Molokai, Kahoolawe, Kauai, and Niihau, comprised of the
15	1st through the-10th, a portion of the 49th (that portion found
16	on the island of Kauai), and the 50th and 51st representative
17	districts.
18	(b) Ten members shall be elected at large from the first
19	school board district. Of the ten members elected at large from
20	that district, one shall be a resident of the third departmental
21	school district (Honolulu), one shall be a resident of the
22	fourth departmental school district (Central Oahu), one shall be
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1	a resident of the fifth departmental school district (Leeward
2	Oahu), and one shall be a resident of the sixth departmental
3	school district (Windward Oahu).
4	(c) Three members shall be elected at large from the
5	second school board district. Of the three members elected at
6	large from that district, one shall be a resident of the first
7	departmental school district (Hawaii), one shall be a resident
8	of the second departmental school district (Maui), and one shall
9	be-a resident of the seventh departmental school district
10	(Kauai).
11	(d) The departmental school districts shall be as follows:
12	First departmental school district (Hawaii): the island of
13	Hawaii comprised of the 1st through the 5th and a portion of the
14	6th (that portion found on the island of Hawaii) representative
15	districts;
16	Second departmental school district (Maui): the islands of
17	Maui, Molokai (including the county of Kalawao), Lanai, and
18	Kahoolawe comprised of a portion of the 6th (that portion found
19	on the island of Maui) and the 7th through the 10th
20	representative districts;



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1	Third-departmental school-district (Honolulu): that
2	portion of the island of Oahu comprised of the 21st through the
3	41st representative districts;
4	Fourth departmental school district (Central Oahu): that
5	portion of the island of Oahu comprised of the 11th through the
6	14th and the 45th representative districts;
7	Fifth departmental school district (Leeward Oahu): that
8	portion of the island of Oahu comprised of the 42nd through the
9	44th, the 46th through the 48th and a portion of the 49th (that
10	portion found on the island of Oahu) representative districts;
11	Sixth departmental school district (Windward Oahu): that
1 2	portion of the island of Oahu comprised of the 15th through the
13	20th representative districts; and
14	Seventh-departmental school district (Kauai): the islands
15	of Kauai and Niihau comprised of a portion of the 49th (that
16	portion found on the island of Kauai) and the 50th and 51st
17	representative districts]. Five of the voting members of the
18	board of education shall be elected by the registered voters of
19	five at-large school board districts as follows:
20	(1) First school board district: senatorial districts one
21	through five;

3	(3)	Third school board district: senatorial districts
4		eight to twelve;

10	(b)	The remaining eight voting members of the board of

14	SECT	ION 4. Section 13-1.1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
15	amended to	o read as follows:

17	of a new a	apportionment plan, the chief election officer, by
18	proclamat	ion issued no later than the tenth day prior to the
19	close of :	filing in elections, shall designate the

21	districts	and the] senatorial districts that comprise the school
22	board dis	tricts described in section 13-1(a) to comply with the

4	SECTION 5. Section 13-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
5	amended to read as follows:

7	of education. No person shall be eligible for election [or		
8	appointment] to the board of education pursuant to section		
9	13-1(a) or appointment to the board of education pursuant to		
10	section 17-6 unless, in the case of a candidate for election to		
11	the board of education pursuant to section 13-1(a) or		
12	appointment to the board of education pursuant to section 17-6,		
13	the person is a <u>resident and</u> registered voter of the school		
14	board district from which the person is to be elected or		
15	appointed [and, where residency in a particular departmental		
16	school district is a requirement, a resident of the departmental		
17	school district for which seat the person is seeking election or		
18	appointment]. No member of the board who has been elected

Except as otherwise provided by this 13 14 chapter, the candidates for the board of education shall be 15 elected in the manner prescribed by this title. [(1) Nomination papers, preparation of. The chief election 16 17 officer shall prepare nomination papers in such a 18 manner that a candidate desiring to file for election 19 to the board of education shall be able to specify 20 whether the candidate is seeking a seat requiring 21 residency in a particular departmental school district 22 or a seat without such residency requirement.



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1 (2) (1) Ballot. The school board ballot shall be 2 prepared in such a manner as to afford every voter 3 eligible to vote in a school board district race the 4 opportunity to vote for each and every candidate 5 seeking election from that school board district. 6 The school board ballot shall contain the names 7 of all board candidates arranged alphabetically in a 8 nonpartisan manner [; provided that the names of 9 candidates seeking seats requiring residency in a 10 particular departmental school district shall be 11 grouped alphabetically according to departmental 12 school districts]. 13 $\left[\frac{3}{2}\right]$ (2) Primary election. Two candidates receiving the 14 most votes for each available seat shall be nominated for the general election. If, after the close of 15 16 filing of nomination papers, there are only two 17 qualified candidates for any seat requiring residency 18 in a particular [departmental] school board district, 19 the chief election officer shall declare those two 20 candidates duly nominated for the general election. 21 The names of those two candidates shall not appear on 22 the primary election ballot.



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1	$\left[\frac{4}{3}\right]$ (3) General election. Each voter in the general
2	election shall be entitled to receive the school board
3	ballot and to vote for the number of seats available
4	in the respective school board districts.
5	(b) [In the event that there is only one qualified
6	candidate for any seat requiring residency in a particular
7	departmental school district, after the close of filing of
8	nomination papers, the chief election officer shall declare such
9	candidate to be duly and legally elected. In the event that] If
10	the number of qualified candidates [for seats without such
11	residency requirement] is equal to or less than the number of
12	[such] seats to be filled, after the close of filing of
13	nomination papers, the chief election officer shall declare
14	[such] those candidates to be duly and legally elected."
15	SECTION 7. Section 17-6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
16	amended to read as follows:
17	"§17-6 Board of education members. (a) The governor
18	shall make an appointment to fill any vacancy in the membership
19	of the board of education <u>left by a member who had been elected</u>
20	pursuant to section 13-1(a) for the unexpired term of that
21	vacancy whenever a vacancy occurs and the term of that vacancy
22	ends at the time of the next succeeding general election.



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1 (b) In the case of a vacancy $[\tau]$ for a member who had been 2 elected pursuant to section 13-1(a), the term of which does not 3 end at the next succeeding general election: 4 (1)If it occurs not later than on the sixtieth day prior 5 to the next succeeding general election, the vacancy 6 shall be filled for the unexpired term at the next 7 succeeding general election. The chief election 8 officer shall issue a proclamation designating the 9 election for filling the vacancy. All candidates for 10 the unexpired term shall file nomination papers not 11 later than 4:30 p.m. on the fiftieth day prior to the 12 general election (but if such day is a Saturday, 13 Sunday, or holiday then not later than 4:30 p.m. on 14 the first working day immediately preceding) and shall 15 be elected in accordance with this title. Pending the 16 election the governor shall make a temporary 17 appointment to fill the vacancy and the person so appointed shall serve until the election of the person 18 duly elected to fill such vacancy. 19 20 (2) If it occurs after the sixtieth day prior to the next

succeeding general election, the governor shall make

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1 an appointment to fill the vacancy for the unexpired 2 term.

3 (c) All appointments made by the governor under this
4 section shall be made without consideration of the appointee's
5 party affiliation or preference or nonpartisanship, however the
6 persons so appointed shall meet the residency requirement
7 specified in section [13-1.] 13-2."

8 SECTION 8. Section 26-35.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
9 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:

10 "(a) For purposes of this section, "member" means any 11 person who is appointed, in accordance with the law, to serve on 12 a temporary or permanent state board, including members of the 13 local school board of any charter school established under 14 chapter 302B, council, authority, committee, or commission, 15 established by law or elected or appointed to the board of education, or the board of trustees of the employees' retirement 16 17 system under section 88-24, or the corporation board of the 18 Hawaii health systems corporation under section 323F-3 and its 19 regional system boards under section 323F-3.5; provided that 20 "member" shall not include any person elected to serve on a 21 board or commission in accordance with chapter 11 other than a 22 person elected to serve on the board of education."



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1 SECTION 9. Section 302A-1101, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended to read as follows: 3 "§302A-1101 Department of education; board of education; 4 superintendent of education. (a) There shall be a principal 5 executive department to be known as the department of education, 6 which shall be headed by [an elected] a policy-making board to 7 be known as the board of education. The board shall have power 8 in accordance with law to formulate statewide educational 9 policy, adopt student performance standards and assessment 10 models, monitor school success, and to appoint the 11 superintendent of education as the chief executive officer of 12 the public school system. The board shall appoint, and may remove, the 13 (b) 14 superintendent by a majority vote of its members. The 15 superintendent: 16 May be appointed without regard to the state residency (1) 17 provisions of section 78-1(b); (2)18 May be appointed for a term of up to four years; and 19 (3) May be terminated only for cause. 20 [(c) The board shall invite the senior military commander 21 in Hawaii to appoint a nonvoting military representative to the 22 board, who shall serve for a two year term without compensation. 2010-0409 SB SMA.doc 23

15	SECTION 10. Section 302A-1110, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
16	amended to read as follows:

18	The educational districts established by section 4-1 shall not
19	be applicable to, nor alter, the school board or departmental
20	school districts, established by [section 13 1,] sections
21	13-1(a) and 302A-B, respectively, or the school districts
22	established for administrative purposes by the department."
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1	SECTION 11. Notwithstanding the requirements of sections
2	26-34 and 302A-E, Hawaii Revised Statutes, upon the effective
3	date of this Act, the terms of all members of the board of
4	education shall expire on November 4, 2012. Commencing
5	November 4, 2012, all elected members of the board of education
6	shall be elected pursuant to the election process established
7	pursuant to this Act.
8	SECTION 12. In codifying the new sections added by section
9	2 of this Act, the revisor of statutes shall substitute
10	appropriate section numbers for the letters used in designating
11	the new sections in this Act.
12	SECTION 13. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
13	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
