BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 235, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

4	"§235- Homeowners construction and remodeling tax
5	credit. (a) There shall be allowed to each individual taxpayer
6	who owns residential real property, subject to the taxes imposed
7	by this chapter, a residential construction and remodeling tax
8	credit that shall be deductible from the taxpayer's net income
9	tax liability, if any, imposed by this chapter for the taxable
10	year in which the credit is properly claimed.
11	The amount of the tax credit claimed under this section by
12	the taxpayer in all years for which the credit is available
13	shall be limited to four per cent of the residential
14	construction or remodeling costs paid by the taxpayer during the
15	taxable year for which the credit is claimed; provided that the
16	costs shall not exceed \$ in the aggregate for each
17	residential unit and that the costs are incurred before
18	July 1, .

- A husband and wife filing separately, or multiple owners of 1 2 a property filing separately may apportion the tax credit between themselves; provided that the tax credit may be claimed 3 4 only once for a single residential property. If a deduction is taken under section 179 (with respect to 5 election to expense depreciable business assets) of the Internal 6 Revenue Code, no tax credit shall be allowed for that portion of 7 8 the construction or remodeling cost for which the deduction is 9 taken. If the tax credit under this section exceeds the 10 11 taxpayer's income tax liability, the excess of credit over 12 liability may be used as a credit against the taxpayer's income tax liability in subsequent years until exhausted. 13 All claims, including amended claims, for a tax credit 14 under this section shall be filed on or before the end of the 15 16 twelfth month following the close of the taxable year for which the credit may be claimed. Failure to comply with the foregoing 17 18 provision shall constitute a waiver of the right to claim the 19 credit. (c) The director of taxation: 20 Shall prepare any forms that may be necessary to claim 21 (1) 22 a tax credit;
