A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO VITAL STATISTICS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that, under existing law, 2 the real property assessment division of each county does not 3 receive regular notice of residents' deaths. Consequently, the 4 members of a deceased person's household can continue to receive 5 a deceased property owner's county real property tax exemption 6 and unfairly benefit from an unreported death. The legislature 7 further finds that if the department of health were to promptly 8 notify each county's real property assessment division each 9 month of deaths that were recorded, the counties would be able 10 to identify deceased persons and remove them from the county 11 real property tax records. The legislature finds that this 12 communication would prevent surviving household members from 13 claiming the deceased person's real property tax exemption and 14 would ensure a more equitable distribution of taxes among real property owners. The legislature further finds that this would 15 16 also prevent subsequent owners of a deceased person's real 17 property from being penalized for inadvertently receiving a real 18 property tax exemption meant for the deceased person.



- 1 The purpose of this Act is to promote the accuracy of real property assessments by requiring the department of health, 2 3 within six weeks of the last day of each month and at no charge, to provide each county's real property assessment division with 4 5 a list of all persons age eighteen and older whose deaths were recorded by the department during the previous month. 6 SECTION 2. Section 338-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 7 8 amended to read as follows: 9 "§338-4 Deaths reported to county clerks[-] and real property assessment divisions. The department of health **10** 11 [shall], within six weeks after the end of each month, shall 12 deliver, or forward by mail, at no charge, to the county clerk 13 and to the real property assessment division of each county a list of the names of all citizens of voting age or over whose 14 deaths have been recorded in the department during each month. 15 **16** The list shall set forth [such] the portion of the information 17 contained in the death record of each citizen whose death is so reported as will be of assistance to the county clerk and county 18 19 real property assessment division in identification [-], and if 20 available, shall include the last four digits of the deceased's social security number, date of birth, date of death, and last 21
