BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

Section 132D-8.6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 1 SECTION 1. 2 amended by amending subsection (f) to read as follows: Any person violating subsection (a), (c), or (d) 3 "(f) shall be subject to the following for shipments of fireworks or 4 5 articles pyrotechnic of: 6 (1)Twenty-five pounds or less gross weight shall be a 7 [petty misdemeanor;] class C felony and the person 8 shall be fined not less than \$10,000; and Over twenty-five pounds to three hundred pounds gross 9 (2)weight shall be a [misdemeanor;] class B felony and 10 the person shall be fined not less than \$50,000. 11 12 [(3) Over three hundred pounds to ten thousand pounds gross 13 weight shall be a class C felony; and 14 (4) More than ten thousand pounds gross weight shall be a 15 class B felony.]" 16 SECTION 2. Section 132D-14, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by amending subsection (a) and (b) to read as follows: 17

does not have a valid permit under sections 132D-10 1 2 and 132D-16, shall be quilty of a class C felony; and Who removes or extracts the pyrotechnic contents from 3 (4) any fireworks or articles pyrotechnic and uses the 4 5 contents to construct fireworks, articles pyrotechnic, or a fireworks or articles pyrotechnic related device 6 7 shall be quilty of a [misdemeanor.] class C felony. 8 Except as provided in subsection (a) or as otherwise (b) 9 specifically provided for in this chapter, any person violating 10 any other provision of this chapter, shall be fined not more 11 than [\$2,000] \$10,000 for each violation." SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that 12 13 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were 14 begun before its effective date. 15 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed and stricken.
