## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HAWAII SURFING RESERVES.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. The legislature finds that designating Hawaii	
2	surfing reserves would recognize important surf sites and		
3	acknowledge their environmental, cultural, sports, and historic		
4	significance in Hawaii. Designation of Hawaii surfing reserves		
5	would raise awareness about the importance of protecting,		
6	nourishing, and developing Hawaii's world famous surf sites.		
7	Designation of Hawaii surfing reserves would not limit enjoyment		
8	of the designated area, particularly with respect to existing		
<b>'</b> 9	recreational and other uses.		
10	A Hawaii surfing reserve designation achieves three		
11	purposes:		
12	(1)	Formal worldwide recognition of the designated surfing	
13		site as an area that has quality surf and significant	
14		cultural, historical, and sports value;	
15	(2)	Recognition of the close relationship between surfers	
16		and the ocean; and	
17	(3)	Promotion of the long-term preservation of Hawaii	
18		surfing reserves.

1	To date, Australia has designated several areas as surfing		
2	reserves, and New Zealand has considered taking similar action		
3	to protect its coastal environment.		
4	The purpose of this Act is to designate the surf breaks:		
5	(1) From the Ala Wai to the Waikiki War Memorial		
6	Natatorium on the island of Oahu; and		
7	(2) From Haleiwa to Sunset beach on the island of Oahu,		
8	as Hawaii surfing reserves.		
9	SECTION 2. Chapter 6E, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended		
10	by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to		
11	read as follows:		
12	"§6E- Hawaii surfing reserves. (a) There is		
13	established:		
14	(1) The Waikiki Hawaii surfing reserve, which shall		
15	include all surf breaks off the area of Oahu bounded		
16	by the Ala Wai and the Waikiki War Memorial		
17	Natatorium; and		
18	(2) The north shore Hawaii surfing reserve, which shall		
19	include all surf breaks off the area of Oahu from Alii		
20	beach in Haleiwa to Sunset beach.		
21	Each Hawaii surfing reserve shall extend from the high water		
22	mark and include all surf breaks within the defined reserve.		
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1	(b)	In connection with Hawaii surfing reserves, the	
2	departmen	t may:	
3.	(1)	Recognize that surfing in all its forms is an asset to	
4		the state of Hawaii;	
5	(2)	Assist in placing appropriate signs or markers	
6		provided by the surfing community, other	
7		organizations, or individuals that are designed to	
8		commemorate and identify the respective Hawaii surfing	
9		reserves; and	
10	(3)	Assist in promoting federal, state, and county	
11		collaboration in nourishing and protecting Hawaii	
12		surfing reserves.	
13	(c)	For the purposes of this section:	
14	"Haw	aii surfing reserve" means a part of the coastal	
15	environme	nt recognized by the community for the cultural and	
16	historical quality and consistency of its surf and its long-term		
17	and ongoing relationship between the surf and surfers. A Hawai		
18	surfing reserve includes the beach and adjacent surf zone from		
19	the high water mark and may include features of the marine and		
20	coastal zone that intrinsically enhance aspects of the surfing		
21	experience.		

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- 1 "Surfer" means any person who interacts physically with the
- 2 surf for recreation, including activities such as bodysurfing,
- 3 bodyboarding, surfing, surfskiing, surfboating, stand-up paddle
- 4 boarding and all forms of surf lifesaving and lifeguarding,
- 5 including tow-in surfing; provided that riding waves on machines
- 6 shall be excluded."
- 7 SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
- 8 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2010.
