A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HAWAII SURFING RESERVES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that designating Hawaii 2 surfing reserves would recognize those surf sites and 3 acknowledge their environmental, cultural, sports, and historic 4 significance in Hawaii. Designation of a Hawaii surfing reserve 5 would raise awareness about the importance of protecting, nourishing, and developing Hawaii's world famous surf sites. 6 7 Designation of a Hawaii surfing reserve would not limit enjoyment of the designated area. 8 9 A Hawaii surfing reserve designation achieves three 10 purposes: Formal worldwide recognition of the sites as surfing areas that have quality surf and significant cultural, historical, recreational, and competitive sports
- 11 12 13 14 value;
- 15 (2) Recognition of the long and close relationship between 16 surfers and the ocean; and

- (3) 1 Promoting the long term preservation of Hawaii surfing 2 reserves for recreation and competitive surfing. 3 To date, Australia has designated several areas as surfing 4 reserves and New Zealand has considered taking similar action to 5 protect its coastal environment. 6 The purpose of this Act is to designate the surfs of 7 Waikiki and the area from Haleiwa to Sunset beach on the north shore of Oahu as Hawaii surfing reserves. 8 SECTION 2. Chapter 6E, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended 9 10 by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to 11 read as follows: Hawaii surfing reserves. (a) There is 12 "§6Eestablished the Waikiki Hawaii surfing reserve, which shall 13 14 include the area of Oahu bounded by the Ala Wai and the Waikiki 15 War Memorial Natatorium that includes all surf breaks; and the north shore Hawaii surfing reserve, which shall include the area 16 of the north shore of Oahu from Ali'i beach in Haleiwa to Sunset 17 beach and includes all surf breaks. Each Hawaii surfing reserve 18 19 shall extend from the high water mark and include all surf 20 breaks within the defined reserve.
- (b) In connection with surfing reserves, the department
- 22 shall:

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1	(1)	Recognize that recreational and competitive surring in
2		all its forms is an asset to the State of Hawaii;
3	(2)	Assist in placing appropriate signs or markers
4		provided by the surfing community, other
5		organizations, or individuals, which are designed to
6		commemorate and identify the respective surfing
7		reserves; and
8	(3)	Assist in promoting federal, state, and county
9		collaboration in nourishing and protecting Hawaii
10		surfing reserves.
11	<u>(c)</u>	For the purpose of this section:
12	<u>"Sur</u>	fer" means any person who interacts physically with the
13	surf for	recreation, including activities such as bodysurfing,
14	body boar	ding, surfing, surfskiing, surfboating, and all forms
15	of surf 1	ifesaving and lifeguarding including tow-in surfing;
16	provided	that riding waves on machines shall be excluded.
17	"Hawaii surfing reserve" means a part of the coastal	
18	environment recognized by the community for the cultural and	
19	historical quality and consistency of its surf and its long-term	
20	and ongoing relationship between the surf and surfers. A Hawaii	
21	surfing reserve includes the beach and adjacent surf zone from	
22	the high water mark and may include features of the marine and	
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- 1 coastal zone that intrinsically enhance aspects of the surfing
- 2 experience."
- 3 SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
- 4 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 2, 2040.
