#### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 302A-411, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
 amended to read as follows:

3 "\$302A-411 Junior kindergarten and kindergarten program;
4 establishment; attendance. (a) The department shall establish
5 and maintain junior kindergartens <u>through the 2012-2013 school</u>
6 <u>year</u> and kindergartens with a program of instruction as a part
7 of the public school system; provided that:

8 (1) Attendance shall not be mandatory; and

9 (2) Charter schools shall be excluded from mandatory10 participation in the program.

(b) The department shall establish a two-tier junior
kindergarten and kindergarten program <u>through the 2012-2013</u>
<u>school year</u> to support the range of developmental abilities of
children in junior kindergarten and kindergarten. Schools shall
not move students between junior kindergarten and kindergarten,
except in cases where the movement is warranted and based on
appropriate assessments determined by:

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1 A qualified teacher with early childhood education (1) 2 background or experience; and 3 The formative and summative assessment of a student's (2) 4 academic, physical, social, and emotional abilities, 5 provided that, beginning with the 2010-2011 school year, the 6 department shall use successful assessment tools and protocols 7 for determining a student's initial placement and for decision 8 making about a student's movement between tiers and into grade 9 one. Junior kindergarten students may graduate directly to 10 grade one when promotion is based on appropriate assessments and 11 other progress data collected over time. 12 (c) Beginning with the 2004-2005 school year, a child who 13 will be at least five years of age on or before December 31 of 14 the school year may attend a public school kindergarten. 15 Beginning with the 2006-2007 school year, a child who will be at 16 least five years of age on or before August 1 of the school year may attend a public school kindergarten. Beginning with the 17 18 2006-2007 school year and through the 2012-2013 school year, a child who will be at least five years of age after August 1 and 19 before January 1 of the school year may attend a public school 20 junior kindergarten. 21



1 (d) The department may accept gifts to establish and 2 maintain junior kindergartens through the 2012-2013 school year 3 and kindergartens. 4 The provisions of this section relating to junior (e) kindergarten shall not be effective after the 2012-2013 school 5 6 year." 7 SECTION 2. Section 302L-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows: 8 9 "(a) There is established an early learning council which 10 shall be attached to the department of education for 11 administrative purposes only, notwithstanding any other law to 12 the contrary. To the extent permissible by law, the council 13 shall develop and administer the early learning system 14 established in section 302L-2 to benefit all children throughout 15 the State, from birth until the time they enter kindergarten. 16 In developing the early learning system, the council shall, 17 among other things: 18 (1)Establish policies and procedures governing its 19 operations; 20 (2) Develop a plan, with goals and objectives, for the 21 early learning system, including the development,

16		(A) Ensuring that more early childhood educators and
17		administrators, existing or potential, have
18		opportunities to receive early childhood
19		education degrees, including offering higher
20		education scholarships;
21		(B) Increasing the availability of early childhood
22		education coursework, including distance learning

5		(D)	Establishing a system for awarding appropriate

12		(E)	Providing consultation on the social-emotional

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#### Report Title:

Education; Junior Kindergarten

#### Description:

Repeals junior kindergartens beginning with the 2013-2014 school year. Limits the early learning council's responsibility for developing a plan to ensure the needs of junior kindergarteners are addressed to run through the 2012-2013 school year.

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
