A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO NON-GENERAL FUNDS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The severe recession of 2008 swept across the nation and many parts of the world with unanticipated force and brought with it enormous challenges for governments at all levels. Its effects on businesses and employment are still being felt today. This has had a profound impact on Hawaii in terms of tax revenues and the state budget.

7 The legislature finds that due to the extraordinary fiscal
8 circumstances the State is facing, non-general funds must be
9 reviewed and scrutinized to determine if there are excess
10 balances available to be transferred to the general fund.

11 The legislature further finds that transfers of excess 12 balances are needed to help address the critical budget 13 shortfall in fiscal year 2009-2010.

14 The legislature further finds that section 37-53, Hawaii
15 Revised Statutes, provides the governor nearly unlimited
16 authority to transfer non-general funds to the general fund.
17 Section 37-53 provides that:



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1 At any time during a fiscal year, notwithstanding any 2 other law to the contrary, any department may, with the approval of the governor or the director of 3 4 finance if so delegated by the governor, transfer from 5 any special fund relating to such department to the 6 general revenues of the State all or any portion of 7 moneys determined to be in excess of fiscal year 8 requirements for such special fund, except for special 9 funds under the control of the department of 10 transportation relating to highways, airports, 11 transportation use, and harbors activities, special 12 funds under the control of the Hawaii health systems 13 corporation or subaccounts under the control of its 14 regional system boards, and special funds of the 15 University of Hawaii. At any time the department of 16 transportation, with the approval of the governor or 17 the director of finance if so delegated by the 18 governor, may transfer from any special fund under the 19 control of the department of transportation, or from 20 any account within any such special fund, to the 21 general revenues of the State or to any other special 22 fund under the control of the department of





transportation all or any portion of moneys determined to be in excess of requirements for the ensuing twelve months determined as prescribed by rules adopted pursuant to chapter 91; provided that no such transfer shall be made which would cause a violation of federal law or federal grant agreements.

7 The purpose of this Act is to help address the fiscal year 8 2009-2010 budget shortfall by transferring a total of 9 \$95,950,000 in excess balances from various non-general funds. 10 SECTION 2. The legislature determines that there is in the 11 state motor pool revolving fund at least \$500,000 in excess of 12 the requirements of the fund. On June 1, 2010, the director of 13 finance is authorized to transfer from the state motor pool revolving fund to the general fund the sum of \$500,000 or so 14 15 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2009-2010.

16 SECTION 3. The legislature determines that there is in the 17 state risk management revolving fund at least \$1,000,000 in 18 excess of the requirements of the fund. On June 1, 2010, the 19 director of finance is authorized to transfer from the state 20 risk management revolving fund to the general fund the sum of 21 \$1,000,000 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal 22 year 2009-2010.





SECTION 4. The legislature determines that there is in the medicaid investigations recovery fund at least \$1,500,000 in excess of the requirements of the fund. On June 1, 2010, the director of finance is authorized to transfer from the medicaid investigations recovery fund to the general fund the sum of \$1,500,000 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2009-2010.

8 SECTION 5. The legislature determines that there is in the 9 University of Hawaii housing assistance revolving fund at least 10 \$2,000,000 in excess of the requirements of the fund. On June 11 1, 2010, the director of finance is authorized to transfer from 12 the University of Hawaii housing assistance revolving fund to 13 the general fund the sum of \$2,000,000 or so much thereof as may 14 be necessary for fiscal year 2009-2010.

15 SECTION 6. The legislature determines that there is in the 16 agricultural reserve fund at least \$500,000 in excess of the 17 requirements of the fund. On June 1, 2010, the director of 18 finance is authorized to transfer from the agricultural reserve 19 fund to the general fund the sum of \$500,000 or so much thereof 20 as may be necessary for fiscal year 2009-2010.

21 SECTION 7. The legislature determines that there is in the 22 agricultural loan revolving fund at least \$1,000,000 in excess



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2 of finance is authorized to transfer from the agricultural loar 3 revolving fund to the general fund the sum of \$1,000,000 or so 4 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2009-2010.

5 SECTION 8. The legislature determines that there is in the 6 agricultural park special fund at least \$200,000 in excess of 7 the requirements of the fund. On June 1, 2010, the director of 8 finance is authorized to transfer from the agricultural park 9 special fund to the general fund the sum of \$200,000 or so much 10 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2009-2010.

SECTION 9. The legislature determines that there is in the aloha tower special fund at least \$750,000 in excess of the requirements of the fund. On June 1, 2010, the director of finance is authorized to transfer from the aloha tower special fund to the general fund the sum of \$750,000 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2009-2010.

SECTION 10. The legislature determines that there is in the clean air special fund at least \$5,000,000 in excess of the requirements of the fund. On June 1, 2010, the director of finance is authorized to transfer from the clean air special fund to the general fund the sum of \$5,000,000 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2009-2010.



SECTION 11. The legislature determines that there is in the community health centers special fund at least \$1,000,000 in excess of the requirements of the fund. On June 1, 2010, the director of finance is authorized to transfer from the community health centers special fund to the general fund the sum of \$1,000,000 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2009-2010.

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8 SECTION 12. The legislature determines that there is in
9 the convention center enterprise special fund at least
10 \$2,000,000 in excess of the requirements of the fund. On June
11 1, 2010, the director of finance is authorized to transfer from
12 the convention center enterprise special fund to the general
13 fund the sum of \$2,000,000 or so much thereof as may be
14 necessary for fiscal year 2009-2010.

15 SECTION 13. The legislature determines that there is in 16 the drinking water treatment revolving loan fund at least 17 \$2,000,000 in excess of the requirements of the fund. On June 18 1, 2010, the director of finance is authorized to transfer from 19 the drinking water treatment revolving loan fund to the general 20 fund the sum of \$2,000,000 or so much thereof as may be 21 necessary for fiscal year 2009-2010.



1 SECTION 14. The legislature determines that there is in 2 the emergency medical services special fund at least \$6,000,000 in excess of the requirements of the fund. On June 1, 2010, the 3 4 director of finance is authorized to transfer from the emergency 5 medical services special fund to the general fund the sum of 6 \$6,000,000 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal 7 year 2009-2010. 8 SECTION 15. The legislature determines that there is in

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9 the environmental management special fund at least \$1,000,000 in 10 excess of the requirements of the fund. On June 1, 2010, the 11 director of finance is authorized to transfer from the 12 environmental management special fund to the general fund the 13 sum of \$1,000,000 or so much thereof as may be necessary for 14 fiscal year 2009-2010.

15 SECTION 16. The legislature determines that there is in 16 the Hawaii cancer research special fund at least \$15,000,000 in 17 excess of the requirements of the fund. On June 1, 2010, the 18 director of finance is authorized to transfer from the Hawaii 19 cancer research special fund to the general fund the sum of 20 \$15,000,000 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal 21 year 2009-2010.



1 SECTION 17. The legislature determines that there is in 2 the high technology special fund at least \$500,000 in excess of 3 the requirements of the fund. On June 1, 2010, the director of 4 finance is authorized to transfer from the high technology 5 special fund to the general fund the sum of \$500,000 or so much 6 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2009-2010. 7 SECTION 18. The legislature determines that there is in 8 the neurotrauma special fund at least \$750,000 in excess of the 9 requirements of the fund. On June 1, 2010, the director of 10 finance is authorized to transfer from the neurotrauma special 11 fund to the general fund the sum of \$750,000 or so much thereof 12 as may be necessary for fiscal year 2009-2010. 13 SECTION 19. The legislature determines that there is in 14 the research and training revolving fund at least \$10,000,000 in 15 excess of the requirements of the fund. On June 1, 2010, the 16 director of finance is authorized to transfer from the research 17 and training revolving fund to the general fund the sum of

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18 \$10,000,000 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal 19 year 2009-2010.

20 SECTION 20. The legislature determines that there is in
21 the systemwide information technology services special fund at
22 least \$750,000 in excess of the requirements of the fund. On





June 1, 2010, the director of finance is authorized to transfer
 from the systemwide information technology services special fund
 to the general fund the sum of \$750,000 or so much thereof as
 may be necessary for fiscal year 2009-2010.

5 SECTION 21. The legislature determines that there is in 6 the trauma system special fund at least \$1,000,000 in excess of 7 the requirements of the fund. On June 1, 2010, the director of 8 finance is authorized to transfer from the trauma system special 9 fund to the general fund the sum of \$1,000,000 or so much 10 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2009-2010.

SECTION 22. The legislature determines that there is in the tuition and fee special fund at least \$20,000,000 in excess of the requirements of the fund. On June 1, 2010, the director of finance is authorized to transfer from the tuition and fee special fund to the general fund the sum of \$20,000,000 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2009-2010.

SECTION 23. The legislature determines that there is in the university revenue-undertakings fund at least \$11,000,000 in excess of the requirements of the fund. On June 1, 2010, the director of finance is authorized to transfer from the university revenue-undertakings fund to the general fund the sum

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of \$11,000,000 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
 year 2009-2010.

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3 SECTION 24. The legislature determines that there is in
4 the vital statistics improvement special fund at least \$500,000
5 in excess of the requirements of the fund. On June 1, 2010, the
6 director of finance is authorized to transfer from the vital
7 statistics improvement special fund to the general fund the sum
8 of \$500,000 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
9 year 2009-2010.

SECTION 25. The legislature determines that there is in the water pollution control revolving fund at least \$10,000,000 in excess of the requirements of the fund. On June 1, 2010, the director of finance is authorized to transfer from the water pollution control revolving fund to the general fund the sum of \$10,000,000 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2009-2010.

SECTION 26. The legislature determines that there is in the works of art special fund at least \$2,000,000 in excess of the requirements of the fund. On June 1, 2010, the director of finance is authorized to transfer from the works of art special fund to the general fund the sum of \$2,000,000 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2009-2010.





1 SECTION 27. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
