A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PARKING FOR DISABLED PERSONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 291-51, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by amending the definitions of "issuing agency" and 2 3 "removable windshield placard" to read as follows: ""Issuing agency" means [an agency authorized by a county to 4 5 issue removable windshield placards, temporary removable windshield placards, special license plates, and identification 6 7 cards pursuant to this part] the disability and communication
- "Removable windshield placard" means a two-sided, hanger-9 style placard issued under this part to a person with a 10 disability who presents a certificate of disability that verifies 11 that the applicant's disability is expected to last for at least 12
- 13 [four] six years."

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- 14 SECTION 2. Section 291-51.3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended to read as follows: 15
- 16 "§291-51.3 Reimbursement to counties. [The State shall reimburse the counties for the unit cost of issuing a removable 17 windshield placard or a temporary removable windshield placard on 18 19 behalf of the State. Beginning July 1, 2006, the rate of the per

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1 unit cost reimbursement shall be \$12. All fees collected by the 2 counties for issuing removable and temporary removable windshield 3 placards shall be deposited into the state general fund. 4 reimbursement rate to the counties to issue removable and 5 temporary removable windshield placards on behalf of the issuing 6 agency shall be established by rules adopted pursuant to section 7 291-56. The counties shall retain any fees collected by the 8 counties." 9 SECTION 3. Section 291-51.6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is **10** amended to read as follows: 11 "§291-51.6 Issuance of temporary removable windshield [Each county] The issuing agency shall issue one **12** temporary removable windshield placard [and a second temporary 13 removable windshield placard] to each applicant who [requests 14 and] presents a certificate of disability that verifies the 15 duration of the applicant's disability in monthly increments, 16 which shall not exceed six months, and upon payment of a fee [to 17 18 the issuing agency. All fees collected by the counties for 19 issuing temporary removable windshield placards shall be **20** deposited into the state general fund. The temporary removable windshield placard shall be designed, fabricated, and sold to the 21 counties at a rate negotiated by the disability and communication 22 access board]. A second temporary removable placard shall be 23 issued upon the request of the applicant." 24

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SECTION 4. Section 291-52, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 1 amended to read as follows: 2 "§291-52 Issuance of removable windshield placard. 3 [Each 4 county | The issuing agency shall issue one removable windshield placard [and a second removable windshield placard] to each 5 applicant who [so requests and] presents a certificate of 6 disability that verifies that the applicant's disability is 7 8 expected to last for at least [four] six years. The removable 9 windshield placard shall expire [four] six years after the date 10 of its issuance. The removable windshield placard shall expire [four] six years after the date of its issuance. [The removable 11 12 windshield placard shall be designed, fabricated, and sold to the 13 counties at a rate negotiated by the disability and communication access board]. A second removable placard shall be issued upon 14 the request of the applicant." 15 **16** SECTION 5. Section 291-52.6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is **17** amended to read as follows: "§291-52.6 Replacement of a lost[$_{7}$] or stolen[$_{7}$ or 18 mutilated] removable windshield placard or identification card. 19 A removable windshield placard, temporary removable windshield **20** placard, or identification card that is reported lost[7] or 21 22 stolen[, or mutilated] shall be replaced upon: (1) Submittal to the issuing agency of [+ 23

Description:

To establish the Disability and Communication Access Board as the issuing agency that authorizes the issuance of removable windshield placards, temporary removable windshield placards, special license plates, and identification cards; to extend the validity of the placard from 4 to 6 years.

TITLE:

PURPOSE:

To (1) establish the Disability and Communication Access Board as the issuing agency that authorizes the issuance of removable windshield

placards, temporary removable windshield placards, special license plates, and identification cards and (2) extend the validity of the placard from 4 to 6

years.

MEANS:

Amend sections 291-51, 291-51.3, 291-51.6, 291-52, 291-52.6, and 291-56, Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS).

JUSTIFICATION:

Public Law 100-641, the Federal Uniform System for Handicapped Parking Law, establishes the State as the entity to administer the parking program for persons with disabilities, with the placard (permit) as a State-issued document. Although Hawaii has chosen to utilize the counties as a mechanism to issue placards on behalf of the State, state law needs to more clearly establish state authority.

Sections 291-51, 291-51.6, and 291-52, HRS, as amended will clarify the State's role as the issuing agency.

Section 291-51.3, HRS, currently mandates that the counties shall issue windshield placards on behalf of the State and that the State shall reimburse the counties for the unit cost at a rate of \$12 per windshield placard issued. As proposed, the bill will allow the counties to issue placards with the rates and fees determined by rules promulgated by the Disability and Communication Access Board rather than statute. The bill will also give the State Disability and Communication Access Board flexibility to issue placards as well.

Section 291-52, HRS, extends the validity of the placard from 4 to 6 years, thus reducing the frequency and cost of future renewals.

Section 291-52.6(1)(A), HRS, amends the requirement to pay for the replacement of a mutilated placard by exchanging it for a new one at no charge.

Impact on the public: Extends the validity of the removable windshield placard by 2 years, saves costs to the consumer by extending the recertification by a qualifying physician, and eliminates a procedural process that was not being used.

Impact on the department and other agencies: Impacts the counties by allowing the Disability and Communication Access Board to issue placards. Will reduce workload on counties. May reduce revenue to counties with reduced workload.
