SECTION 1. Section 286-102, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows: 2 A person operating the following category or 3 combination of categories of motor vehicles shall be examined as 4 provided in section 286-108 and duly licensed by the examiner of 5 drivers: Mopeds; (1)7 Motorcycles and motor scooters; (2) 8 (3)Passenger cars of any gross vehicle weight rating, buses designed to transport fifteen or fewer 10 occupants, and trucks and vans having a gross vehicle 11 weight rating of fifteen thousand pounds or less; and 12 (4)All of the motor vehicles in category (3) and [trucks 13 having a gross vehicle weight rating of fifteen 14 thousand one through twenty six thousand pounds.] any 15 vehicle that is not a commercial motor vehicle. 16 A school bus or van operator shall be properly licensed to 17 operate the category of vehicles that the operator operates as a 18
