## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CHARTER SCHOOLS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to clarify certain 2 statutory provisions vis-a-vis the education laboratory school, which is a charter school within the meaning of chapter 302B, 3 Hawaii Revised Statutes, whose charter was approved by the board 4 of education on August 16, 2001. These sections regarding the 5 6 education laboratory school which are being clarified by this Act exist in chapter 304A, Hawaii Revised Statutes. Other 7 clarifications in those sections are needed in order to: 8 9 Ensure that the State complies with the donative (1)intent of the Castle family of Kaneohe when they 10 donated certain buildings to the University of Hawaii 11 with the explicit understanding that the donated 12 13 buildings be utilized for elementary and secondary 14 school educational purposes only; and Exempt the current provision in section 304A-2266, 15 (2)16 Hawaii Revised Statutes, which allows the education laboratory school to charge tuition for summer school 17 18 from the general statutory provision in section 302B-



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12(f), Hawaii Revised Statutes, which prohibits
 charter schools from charging tuition. This is in
 line with the current public school policy of charging
 tuition for summer school classes while not charging
 tuition for classes that are conducted during the
 regular school year.

7 SECTION 2. Section 304A-1006, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
8 amended to read as follows:

9 "[+] §304A-1006[+] Compensation of education laboratory 10 school cafeteria personnel. The compensation of all cafeteria 11 workers and the cafeteria manager at the education laboratory 12 school cafeteria, or any successor organization or unit, shall 13 be paid out of the general fund of the State. The university 14 shall include, in its budgetary request for each upcoming fiscal 15 period, the amounts necessary to carry out the purposes of this 16 section. For purposes of this section, "education laboratory school" mean the same school as in section 304A-2266. As used 17 18 in this section, the education laboratory school cafeteria means 19 the cafeteria that prepares meals for the students of the 20 educational laboratory school, with that cafeteria being located 21 in the multi-purpose building, which is located in the mauka-ewa 22 corner of the intersection of Dole street and University avenue, SB LRB 10-1169.doc

| 17 | SECTION 3. Section 304A-2266, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is        |

| 20 | programs revolving fund. There is established the education      |
| 21 | laboratory school summer programs revolving fund, from which     |
| 22 | shall be paid the cost of operations of the education laboratory |

| 18                     | provided that no member of that local school board who           |

| 21                     | limited to university employees, shall be a voting               |

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1 SECTION 4. In implementing the provisions in section 3 of 2 this Act, the individuals who are education laboratory school 3 local school board members and barred from holding positions on 4 that local school board for three years, with the education 5 laboratory school's then current by-laws being repealed and the initial by-laws of the education laboratory school being 6 reinstated in its place, and with the individual who was the 7 initial chair of that local school board being placed in that 8 position of chair for a period of three years. Thereafter that 9 initial chair shall appoint individuals to fill all of the 10 vacancies on that local school board except for those vacant 11 12 positions whose position holders must be selected by their constituent groups pursuant to section 302B-7, Hawaii Revised 13 14 Statutes, with those replacements being selected pursuant to the 15 selection process in section 302B-7, Hawaii Revised Statutes; provided that after the initial appointment of that local school 16 board's members who hold appointed positions, whenever a vacancy 17 18 in an appointed local school board member position occurs, the 19 individual who is the chair of that local school board at the time the vacancy occurs shall appoint the individual to fill 20 21 that vacancy.



1 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 2 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

3 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
