A BILL FOR AN ACT

PROPOSING AN AMENDMENT TO ARTICLE I OF THE CONSTITUTION OF THE STATE OF HAWAII.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the courts and the
2	legislature have, intermittently since the 1990s, been called
3	upon to address laws regarding who may legally marry in Hawaii.
4	More than a decade has passed, yet this issue remains
5	unresolved. Accordingly, the legislature further finds that the
6	people of Hawaii have the right and responsibility to vote on
7	what legally constitutes a marriage. The purpose of this Act is
8	to propose an amendment to article I of the Constitution of the
9	State of Hawaii to reserve marriage to opposite-sex couples.
10	SECTION 2. Article I, section 23, of the Constitution of
11	the State of Hawaii is amended to read as follows:
12	"MARRIAGE
13	
14	Section 23. [The legislature shall have the power to
15	reserve marriage to opposite sex couples.] Marriage shall be
16	reserved to opposite-sex couples."



- 1 SECTION 3. The question to be printed on the ballot shall
- 2 be as follows:
- 3 "Shall the Constitution of the State of Hawaii be amended to
- 4 require that marriage shall be reserved to opposite-sex
- 5 couples?"
- 6 SECTION 4. Constitutional material to be repealed is
- 7 bracketed and stricken. New constitutional material is
- 8 underscored.
- 9 SECTION 5. This amendment shall take effect upon
- 10 compliance with article XVII, section 3, of the Constitution of

11 the State of Hawaii.
