A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PRESCRIPTION DRUGS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. (a) There is established the medication
2	therapy ma	anagement task force within the department of health
3	for admin	istrative purposes and consisting of the following
4	members:	
5	(1)	The director of health;
6	(2)	At least one member of the board of pharmacy;
7	(3)	The dean of the University of Hawaii John A. Burns
8		school of medicine or the dean's designee; and
9	(4)	The dean of the University of Hawaii at Hilo college
10		of pharmacy or the dean's designee.
11	The direct	or of health shall appoint the task force members by
12	August 1,	2010, and also request that individuals from the
13	following	groups participate as members of the task force:
14	(1)	One pharmacist each from Walgreens and Long's Drugs
15		and representatives from two independent pharmacies;
16		and
17	(2)	A member of the Hawaii Medical Association.

1	The task force shall elect from among its members a
2	chairperson and any other officers it deems necessary. Members
3	of the task force shall not be compensated.
4	A majority of the members of the task force shall
5	constitute a quorum of the task force. A quorum shall be
6	required to approve standards, policies, and procedures
7	developed by the task force pursuant to this Act.
8	The task force shall convene its initial meeting no later
9	than twenty days after the director of health has appointed all
10	of the members of the taskforce.
11	(b) The task force shall:
12	(1) Study medication therapy management programs
13	implemented in other states that authorize pharmacists
14	through a collaborative pharmacy practice agreement to
15	provide medication therapy management;
16	(2) Develop standards, policies, and procedures to enable
17	each pharmacy in the state that provides pharmacy
18	services to qualified QUEST patients to maintain the
19	capacity to offer medication therapy management
20	services;
21	(3) Make recommendations on what the scope of medication
22	therapy management should cover; and

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1	(4) Develop standards, policies, and procedures for
2	ensuring accurate record keeping and administration of
3	a medication therapy management program to address
4	issues such as patients using multiple pharmacies.
5	For the purposes of this subsection, "medication therapy
6	management" means the treatment of disease or disorder through
7	the use of prescription or non-prescription medications.
8	(c) The task force, through the department of health,
9	shall submit to the legislature, its findings and
10	recommendations, including any proposed legislation, no later
11	than twenty days prior to the convening of the 2011 regular
12	session.
13	(d) The task force shall cease to exist on June 30, 2011.
14	SECTION 2. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2055.
