RELATING TO PHARMACIES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 461, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated		
3	and to read as follows:		
4	" <u>§461-</u> Electronic prescriptions; capacity required. (a)		
5	Every pharmacy and remote dispensing pharmacy operating under a		
6	permit or prior notification issued pursuant to this chapter		
7	shall have the capacity to maintain prescription records		
8	electronically and to accept and transmit prescription		
9	information electronically in accordance with the requirements		
10	of sections 328-17.7 and 328-17.8."		
11	SECTION 2. Section 328-17.7, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
12	amended to read as follows:		
13	"§328-17.7 Record of prescriptions. (a) Every		
14	practitioner, pharmacist, or medical oxygen distributor who		
15	compounds, sells, or delivers any prescribed drug to a patient		
16	or a patient's agent shall maintain records that identify:		
17	(1) The specific drug product dispensed, including

1		(A) The product's national drug code (NDC) number; or
2		(B) The brand name or the established name and the
3		name or commonly accepted abbreviation of the
4		principal labeler of the drug product dispensed,
5		the product strength, and the dosage form;
6	(2)	The quantity of the drug;
7	(3)	Directions for use;
8	(4)	The number of allowable refills;
9	(5)	The date of initial dispensing and the dates of all
10		refilling;
11	(6)	The date of any transfer of the prescription;
12	(7)	The name, business address, and telephone number of
13		the recipient pharmacist or medical oxygen distributor
14		for any transfer of prescription;
15	(8)	The prescribing practitioner, including name, business
16		address, and telephone number;
17	(9)	The format (oral, written, or electronic) in which the
18		prescription was received;
19	(10)	The patient, including name, address, and telephone
20		number;
21	(11)	The date of prescribing; and



The name of the practitioner, pharmacist, or medical 1 (12)2 oxygen distributor dispensing the drug. 3 Every prescription dispensed shall have the name of the 4 pharmacist, dispensing practitioner, or medical oxygen 5 distributor responsible for the dispensing appended to the prescription record, and every prescription record shall be 6 preserved and legible for a period of not less than five years. 7 8 The prescription records shall be subject at all times to the inspection of the director of health or the director's agent. 9 10 Prescription records [may] shall be electronically (b) 11 maintained using an appropriate prescription information processing system; provided that: 12 There [are] shall be procedures to maintain the 13 (1)records, including but not limited to auxiliary 14 procedures for backing up files, computer downtime, 15 and the protection of patient confidentiality; and 16 Upon request the prescription records, or a subset 17 (2) 18 thereof, shall be provided to the director or the director's agent, in a form specified by the director, 19 20 within forty-eight hours. (c) Prescription records shall be maintained

electronically [or manually] such that the information contained 22



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1 in the records is readily retrievable during the pharmacy's
2 normal operating hours."

3 SECTION 3. Each pharmacy and remote dispensing pharmacy
4 subject to chapter 461, Hawaii Revised Statutes, shall be in
5 compliance with this Act by no later than January 1, 2011.
6 Failure to comply with this Act shall constitute a violation of
7 chapter 461, Hawaii Revised Statutes, and subject to any
8 disciplinary action imposed by the board of pharmacy pursuant to
9 section 461-21, Hawaii Revised Statutes.

SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketedand stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

12 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2010.
