## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ADMINISTRATIVE LICENSE REVOCATION.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 291E, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by adding a new subpart to part III to be appropriately 3 designated and to read as follows: 4 Eligibility for License Following "B. 5 Lifetime Revocation 6 §291E-A Eligibility to apply for new driver's license 7 after lifetime revocation. A respondent whose license has been 8 administratively revoked for life pursuant to section 291E-41 or 9 under provisions of sections 286-251 to 286-266 of part XIV of 10 chapter 286 that were repealed by Act 189, Session Laws of 11 Hawaii 2000, may apply in writing to the director for consent to 12 apply for a new driver's license as provided under this part. Α 13 respondent whose driver's license has been revoked for a 14 lifetime more than once shall not be eliqible to apply for new 15 driver's license under this part.

8		by a certified substance abuse counselor who has
9		determined that the respondent is not in need of
10		substance abuse treatment due to dependency or abuse
11		under the applicable Diagnostic and Statistical Manual
12		and Addiction Severity Index or its successor;
13		provided that the assessment shall be submitted with
14		the application; and provided further that the costs
15	7	of the assessment shall be borne by the respondent;

17	(3)	The application shall be in a form of a sworn

18 statement approved by the director; provided that the 19 sworn statement shall contain information that 20 demonstrates that the respondent no longer poses a 21 real and serious danger to the safety and welfare of 22 the people of this State.

5 SECTION 2. Section 291E-41, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
6 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:

7 "(a) Unless an administrative revocation is reversed or 8 the temporary permit is extended by the director, administrative 9 revocation shall become effective on the day specified in the 10 notice of administrative revocation. Except as provided in 11 section 291E-44[7] or 291E-A, no license and privilege to 12 operate a vehicle shall be restored under any circumstances 13 during the administrative revocation period. Upon completion of 14 the administrative revocation period, the respondent may reapply 15 and be reissued a license pursuant to section 291E-45."

16 SECTION 3. Chapter 291E, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 17 amended by designating sections 291E-31 to 291E-50 as subpart A, 18 and inserting a title before section 291E-31 to 291E-31 to read 19 as follows:

21 SECTION 4. In codifying the provisions of section 1 of22 this Act, the revisor of statutes shall substitute appropriate

#### Report Title:

DUI; Administrative License Revocation

#### Description:

Permits driver whose license has been administratively revoked for life to seek reinstatement of the license after 10 years have passed since the occurrence of the lifetime revocation. Requires driver to have had no arrests or convictions for driving while license revoked and to be free from dependency or abuse of alcohol and drugs. Effective 7/1/11.
