A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MOTOR CARRIERS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to remove the
- 2 exemption from regulation and oversight by the public utilities
- 3 commission for entities transporting garbage or refuse. During
- 4 the last five years, many condominium and single-family
- 5 residents have complained about the noise emanating from back-up
- 6 beeping or horns used by early-morning trash haulers contracted
- 7 as private commercial entities in high-density condominium
- 8 neighborhoods.
- 9 Private trash haulers have cited the need to make their
- 10 pick-ups in time to meet city dumpsite closure times, and
- 11 frequently are in residential neighborhoods as early as 4:00 am
- 12 to collect garbage and refuse. Although residents, legislators,
- 13 and various business establishments have sought to develop
- 14 solutions to this problem over the last three years, none of the
- 15 recommendations for solution have yielded adequate relief to
- 16 residents disturbed by the early-morning beeping or horns used
- 17 by commercial garbage or refuse trucks.

. 1	SECT	ION 2. Section 271-5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended t	o read as follows:
3	"§27	1-5 Exemptions, generally. Notwithstanding any other
4	provision	s of this chapter, its contents shall not apply to:
5	(1)	Persons transporting their own property where the
6		transportation is in furtherance of a primary business
7		purpose or enterprise of that person, except where the
8		transportation is undertaken by a motor carrier to
9		evade the regulatory purposes of this chapter;
10	(2)	Persons operating motor vehicles when engaged in the
11		transportation of school children and teachers to and
12		from school, and to and from school functions;
13		provided that these persons may engage in providing
14		transportation at special rates for groups of persons
15		belonging to an eleemosynary or benevolent
16		organization or association domiciled in this State
17		where the organization or association sponsors or is
18		conducting a nonregular excursion; provided that
19		whenever the persons engage in the transportation of
20		persons other than those exempted in this paragraph,
21		that portion of their operation shall not be exempt

from this chapter. Nothing in this paragraph shall be

1		construed to authorize any person to engage in the
2		transportation of persons, other than the
3		transportation of persons exempted by the terms of
4		this paragraph, without a permit or certificate issued
5		by the commission authorizing such transportation;
6	(3)	Persons operating taxicabs or other motor vehicles
7		utilized in performing a bona fide taxicab service.
8		"Taxicab" includes:
9	N.	(A) Any motor vehicle used in the movement of
10		passengers on the public highways under the
11		following circumstances, namely the passenger
12		hires the vehicle on call or at a fixed stand,
13		with or without baggage for transportation, and
14		controls the vehicle to the passenger's
15		destination;
16		(B) Any motor vehicle for hire having seating
17		accommodations for eight or fewer passengers used
18		in the movement of passengers on the public
19		highways that may, as part of a continuous trip,
20	·	pick up or discharge passengers from various
21		unrelated locations; provided that they shall be

T		section 40-10.5(c), and provided rarener onde
2		this subparagraph shall not apply to any
3		exclusive rights granted by the department of
4		transportation for taxicab services at facilities
5		under the department's control; and
6	(C)	Any motor vehicle having seating accommodations
7		for eight or fewer passengers used in the
8	* :	movement of passengers on the public highways
9		between a terminal, i.e., a fixed stand, in the
10		Honolulu district, as defined in section 4-1 and
11		a terminal in a geographical district outside the
12		limits of the Honolulu district, and vice versa,
13		without picking up passengers other than at the
14		terminals or fixed stands; provided that the
15		passengers may be picked up by telephone call
16		from their homes in the rural area or may be
17		unloaded at any point between the fixed stands or
18		may be delivered to their homes in the rural
19		area;
20	(4) Per	sons operating motor vehicles in the transportation
21	of	persons pursuant to a franchise from the

1		registrature and whose operations are presently
2		regulated under chapter 269;
3	(5)	Nonprofit agricultural cooperative associations to the
4		extent that they engage in the transportation of their
5		own property or the property of their members;
6	(6)	Persons operating motor vehicles specially constructed
7		for the towing of disabled or wrecked vehicles but not
8		otherwise used in the transportation of property for
9		compensation or hire;
10	(7)	Persons operating motor vehicles in the transportation
11		of mail, newspapers, periodicals, magazines, messages,
12		documents, letters, or blueprints;
13	(8)	Persons operating funeral cars or ambulances;
14	[-(9)	Persons operating motor vehicles in the transportation
15		of garbage or refuse;
16	(10)]	(9) Persons operating the type of passenger carrying
17		motor vehicles known as "sampan buses" within the
18		radius of twenty miles from the city of Hilo, Hawaii;
19	[(11)]	(10) Persons transporting unprocessed pineapple to a
20		cannery, seed corn to a processing facility, or
21		returning any containers used in such transportation
22		to the fields;



1	[(12)]	(11) Sugar plantations transporting sugarcane, raw
2		sugar, molasses, sugar by-products, and farming
3		supplies for neighboring farmers pursuant to contracts
4		administered by the United States Department of
5		Agriculture;
6	[(13) -]	(12) Persons engaged in the ranching or meat or feed
7		business who transport cattle to slaughterhouses for
8		hire where such transportation is their sole
9		transportation for hire and where their earnings from
10		the transportation constitute less than fifty per cent
11		of their gross income from their business and the
12		transportation for hire;
13	[(14)]	(13) Persons transporting unprocessed raw milk to
14		processing plants and returning any containers used in
15		such transportation to dairy farms for reloading;
16	[(15)]	(14) Persons transporting animal feeds to animal
17		husbandry farmers and farming supplies directly to
18.		animal husbandry farmers and returning any containers
19		used in such transportation to these sources of such
20)	feeds and supplies for reloading;
21	[(16)]	(15) Persons engaged in transporting not more than
22		fifteen passengers between their places of abode, or

1		termini near such places, and their places of
2		employment in a single daily round trip where the
3		driver is also on the driver's way to or from the
4		driver's place of employment;
5	[(17)]	(16) Persons transporting passengers without charge
6		in motor vehicles owned or operated by such person,
7		where such transportation is provided in conjunction
8		with and in furtherance of a related primary business
9		purpose or enterprise of that person, and such
10		transportation is provided only directly to and from
11		the place of business of such person, except that this
12		exemption shall not apply to persons making any
13		contract, agreement, or arrangement to provide,
14		procure, furnish, or arrange for transportation as a
15		travel agent or broker or a person engaged in tour or
16		sightseeing activities, nor shall this exemption apply
17		where the transportation is undertaken by a person to
18		evade the regulatory purposes of this chapter; and
19	[(18)]	(17) Persons conducting the type of county-regulated
20		passenger carrying operation known as "jitney
21		services". For the purposes of this paragraph,
22		"jitney services" means public transportation services

1	utilizing motor vehicles that have seating
2	accommodations for six to twenty-five passengers,
3	operate along specific routes during defined service
4	hours, and levy a flat fare schedule."
5	SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
6	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
7	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
