A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ARTIFICIAL TRANS FAT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that trans fatty acids, 2 also known as trans fat, have a detrimental impact on a person's 3 health by: Increasing the blood insulin level in response to 4 (1) glucose load; 5 (2) Affecting immune response; 6 Decreasing the response of red blood cells to insulin; 7 (3) Causing alterations in the physiological properties of 8 (4)9 biological membranes; Causing alterations in adipose cell size, cell number, 10 (5) lipid class, and fatty acid composition; 11 12 Lowering serum high density lipoprotein cholesterol; 13 and Impairing endothelium cells. 14 (7) In 1997, a New England Journal of Medicine study found that 15 eating one gram of trans fat a day for a decade increased the 16 risk of cardiovascular disease by twenty per cent. Also, a 17 Harvard Medical School study showed that high trans fat intake 18

- 1 represents a significant risk for developing premature diabetes.
- 2 Trans fat increases the risk of heart disease and stroke by
- 3 increasing levels of so-called bad cholesterol or low density
- 4 lipoprotein, and reducing levels of good cholesterol or high
- 5 density lipoprotein.
- 6 The purpose of this Act is to restrict public schools from
- 7 serving foods containing artificial trans fat, before and during
- 8 school or through vending machines.
- 9 SECTION 2. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 10 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 11 and to read as follows:
- 12 "§302A- Trans fat; restricting availability at schools.
- 13 (a) For the purposes of this section,
- 14 "Artificial trans fat" means vegetable shortening,
- 15 margarine, or any kind of partially hydrogenated vegetable oil,
- 16 unless the manufacturer's documentation or the label required on
- 17 a food, pursuant to applicable federal or state law, lists the
- 18 trans fat content of the food as less than 0.5 grams of trans
- 19 fat per serving.
- 20 "School food service establishment" means a place that
- 21 regularly sells or serves a food item or meal on a public school
- 22 campus.

1	(b) No school food service establishment, during school
2	hours or one and one-half hours before or after school, or
3	vending machine situated on public school property shall offer
4	students any food containing artificial trans fat or use food
5	containing artificial trans fat in the preparation of any food
6	item served to students.
7	(c) This section shall not apply to food provided as part
8	of a United States Department of Agriculture meal program."
9	SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
10	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
