A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE ALOHA TOWER DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	PART I
2	SECTION 1. Chapter 206J, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
3	repealed.
4	SECTION 2. Except as otherwise provided in this Act, all
5	rights, powers, functions, and duties of the Aloha Tower
6	development corporation are transferred to the Hawaii community
7	development authority under chapter 206E, Hawaii Revised
8	Statutes, except with respect to harbors modernization functions
9	which shall be transferred to the department of transportation,
10	harbors division.
11	SECTION 3. All appropriations, records, equipment,
12	machines, files, supplies, contracts, books, papers, documents,
13	maps, and other personal property heretofore made, used,
14	acquired, or held by the Aloha Tower development corporation
15	relating to the functions transferred to the Hawaii community
16	development authority shall be transferred with the functions to
17	which they relate.

1	PART II
2	SECTION 4. Chapter 206E, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
3	amended by adding two new sections to be appropriately
4	designated and to read as follows:
5	"§206E- Aloha Tower fund. There is created the Aloha
6	Tower fund, to be placed for administrative purposes under the
7	authority. All:
8	(1) Moneys;
9	(2) Rentals;
10	(3) Charges;
11	(4) Other revenues of the authority; and
12	(5) Moneys or charges received by the department of
13	business, economic development, and tourism;
14	including reimbursements for costs and staff services as a
15	result of planning, development, or redevelopment of the lands
16	located seaward of Nimitz Highway between Pier 4 and the
17	Honolulu International Airport shall be deposited into the fund
18	§206E- Aloha Tower. (a) The authority shall be
19	responsible for the development, planning, construction,
20	improvement, repair, and reconstruction of projects within the
21	Aloha Tower complex as follows: the area bounded by Nimitz
22	Highway beginning at its intersection with the Diamond Head
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- 1 boundary of tax map key 2-1-13:7 north along Nimitz Highway to
- 2 its intersection with the makai boundary of tax map key 1-7-1:6;
- 3 northeast along River Street to its intersection with King
- 4 Street; north along King Street to its intersection with Iwilei
- 5 Road west along Iwilei Road to its intersection with Nimitz
- 6 Highway at the Ewa makai corner of tax map key 1-5-08:1; south
- 7 along Nimitz Highway to its intersection with the boundary
- 8 between tax map key 1-5-8:1 and tax map key 1-5-8:9; west along
- 9 a line to the Diamond Head mauka corner of tax map key 1-5-40:4;
- 10 west along Nimitz Highway to its intersection with the Ewa
- 11 boundary of tax map key 1-5-38:4; south along the Ewa boundaries
- 12 of tax map key 1-5-38:4 and 1-5-38:5 to Honolulu Harbor; east
- 13 along the waterfront boundary of tax map key 1-5-38:5 to Pier
- 14 23; south along Pier 23 to the southwest end of Pier 22;
- 15 continuing along a line in the same direction to its
- 16 intersection with the Honolulu Harbor Federal Project Line;
- 17 northeast along the Honolulu Harbor Federal Project Line to a
- 18 point in Honolulu Harbor 475 feet perpendicular to Pier 11;
- 19 southwest along a line parallel to Piers 10 and 11 to its
- 20 intersection with a line extending from the southwest end of
- 21 Pier 22 to the point of intersection of the Honolulu Harbor
- 22 Federal Project Line and a line extending along Pier 8 into



- 1 Honolulu Harbor; southeast along a line to the point of
- 2 intersection of the Honolulu Federal Project Line and a line
- 3 extending along Pier 8 into Honolulu Harbor; southeast along the
- 4 Honolulu Harbor Federal Project Line to its intersection with a
- 5 line extending along Pier 4 into Honolulu Harbor; east along a
- 6 line from that intersection and along Pier 4 to its intersection
- 7 with Nimitz Highway; north along Nimitz Highway to its
- 8 intersection with Richards Street; southwest along Richards
- 9 Street to its intersection with Ala Moana Boulevard; northwest
- 10 along Ala Moana Boulevard to its intersection with the Ewa
- 11 boundary of tax map key 2-1-14:6; northeast along the Ewa
- 12 boundary of tax map key 2-1-14:6 to its Ewa mauka corner; and
- 13 northwest across Bishop Street to the point of beginning at the
- 14 intersection of the Diamond Head boundary of tax map key
- 15 2-1-13:7 and Nimitz Highway. The complex shall also include the
- 16 area bounded by Iwilei Road beginning with its intersection with
- 17 Nimitz Highway; west along Iwilei Road to its intersection with
- 18 Pacific Street; southeast along Pacific Street to its
- 19 intersection with the Ewa mauka corner of tax map key 1-5-38:4;
- 20 east along Nimitz Highway to its intersection with the Diamond
- 21 Head mauka corner of tax map key 1-50-40:4; east along a line to
- 22 the point of intersection at the boundary between tax map key



1	1-5-8:1 and tax map key $1-5-8:9$; north along Nimitz Highway to		
2	the point of beginning at the intersection of Nimitz Highway and		
3	Iwilei Road; all fast and submerged lands contained within these		
4	areas shall also be included.		
5	(b) The authority, with the approval of the governor, may		
6	issue bonds in amounts as authorized from time to time by law as		
7	deemed advisable for any of its purposes. Any bonds issued by		
8	the Aloha Tower development corporation prior to July 1, 2010,		
9	shall be deemed to be issued in the name of the authority on		
10	July 1, 2010.		
11	(c) Three additional voting members shall be appointed to		
12	the authority by the governor to represent Aloha Tower. These		
13	members shall be considered in determining quorum and majority		
14	only on issues relating to Aloha Tower, and may vote only on		
15	issues relating to Aloha Tower. These members shall consist of:		
16	(1) The director of transportation or designee in charge		
17	of harbors; and		
18	(2) Two public members appointed as follows:		
19	(A) One member to be appointed from a list of two		
20	persons submitted to the governor by the senate		
21	president; and		

1	(B) One member to be appointed from a list of two
2	persons submitted to the governor by the speaker
3	of the house of representatives."
4	PART III
5	SECTION 5. Chapter 266, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
6	amended by adding two new sections to be appropriately
7	designated and to read as follows:
8	"§266- Harbors modernization group; commercial harbors
9	modernization plan; harbors division. (a) No later than July
10	1, 2010, the harbors modernization group shall be
11	administratively placed under the department of transportation,
12	harbors division. The harbors modernization group shall assume
13	jurisdiction over the harbors modernization project from the
14	Aloha Tower development corporation, to undertake projects for
15	the commercial harbors modernization plan. All projects, prior
16	to implementation, shall be approved by the governor. If the
17	governor approves a project, the harbors modernization group
18	shall have expending authority over the approved project,
19	notwithstanding any law to the contrary.
20	For purposes of this subsection, the department of
21	transportation, harbors division, shall seek the input and
22	guidance of the United States Department of Transportation,
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1	maticine Administration, in the management of the narbors
2	modernization project; provided that the department of
3	transportation, harbors division, may enter into an agreement
4	with the United States Department of Transportation Maritime
5	Administration for the purpose of infrastructure improvements of
6	harbors statewide.
7	(b) The harbors modernization group shall have
8	jurisdiction over harbors projects, collectively to be known as
9	the commercial harbors modernization plan, which shall be
10	completed no later than June 30, 2017. These harbor projects
11	shall be as follows:
12	(1) Honolulu harbor. Development of infrastructure,
13	expansion of facilities, and tenant relocations,
14	including the development of the new Kapalama
15	container terminal;
16	(2) Kahului harbor. Development of infrastructure,
17	expansion of facilities, tenant relocations, and
18	acquisition of lands, including the West harbor barge
19	or ferry slip or both, West harbor dredging and
20	breakwater, West harbor cruise terminal, Pier 1 fuel
21	line replacement and upgrade, East harbor breakwater,
22	and Pier 2B strengthening;

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1	(3)	Hana harbor. Development of infrastructure,
2		demolition, as necessary, and expansion of facilities
3		and acquisition of lands;
4	(4)	Hilo harbor. Development of infrastructure, expansion
5		of facilities, tenant relocations, and acquisition of
6		lands, including the Pier 4 interisland cargo
7		terminal;
8	(5)	Kawaihae harbor. Development of infrastructure,
9		expansion of facilities, tenant relocations,
10		acquisition of lands, including the Pier 2 terminal
11		and barge improvements, Pier 2 extension and terminal,
12		and Pier 4 and liquid bulk terminals;
13	(6)	Kalaeloa harbor. Development of infrastructure,
14		expansion of facilities, tenant relocations, and
15		acquisition of lands, including the West harbor
16		infrastructure, Pier 4 dedicated fuel pier, and
17		extension of the fuel line; and
18	<u>(7)</u>	Nawiliwili harbor. Development of infrastructure,
19		expansion of facilities, tenant relocations, and
20		acquisition of lands, including the new multi-use
21		pier.

1	<u>(c)</u>	Land disposition matters in projects identified in the		
2	commercial harbors modernization plan, including land			
3	acquisition, leasing, and conveyance, and acquisition of			
4	easements or right-of-ways, shall continue to be under the			
5	jurisdiction of the board of land and natural resources pursuan			
6	to chapte	chapter 171.		
7	(d)	(d) The harbors modernization group shall be comprised of		
8	four voting members, as follows:			
9	(1)	The director of transportation, or designee, who shall		
10		serve as chairperson;		
11	(2)	The director of finance, or designee; and		
12	(3)	Two public members, not including any officer or		
13		employee of the State, one to be appointed by the		
14		governor from a list of three nominees submitted to		
15		the governor by the president of the senate, and one		
16		to be approved by the governor from a list of three		
17		nominees submitted to the governor by the speaker of		
18		the house of representatives; provided that the two		
19		public members shall each be directly involved with:		
20		(A) Any harbor or offshore mooring facility in the		
21		State that is primarily involved with the		
22		movement of commercial cargo and passenger		

1		vesse	els entering, departing, or traveling within
2		the s	state harbor system;
3		(B) An ac	ctivity that requires or is otherwise
4		direc	ctly related to the loading, offloading,
5		stora	age, or distribution of goods and services by
6		means	s of seaborne transportation; or
7		(C) Activ	vities, which:
8		<u>(i)</u>	Promote the welfare, growth, and economic
9			interests of Hawaii's commercial harbors and
10			harbor facilities;
11		<u>(ii)</u>	Assist and inform harbor users of, and
12			assist harbor users in, the interpretation
13			of laws, rules, regulations, and proposed
14			and pending legislation applicable to Hawaii
15			harbors and harbor facilities, for
16			compliance purposes; and
17		<u>(iii)</u>	Foster and encourage the development and
18			improvement of Hawaii harbors and harbor
19			facilities.
20	The n	nembers of	the harbors modernization group shall serve
21	for four y	rear terms	and shall continue in office until their
22	respective	e successor	rs have been appointed.

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1	The members of the harbors modernization group shall serve
2	without compensation, but each member shall be reimbursed for
3	expenses, including travel expenses, incurred in the performance
4	of their duties.
5	For purposes of conducting business, a majority of the
6	members of the harbors modernization group shall constitute a
7	quorum. For purposes of voting, a majority of the quorum shall
8	be required for decision making.
9	(e) The department of transportation may apply any
10	revenues derived from commercial development projects in the
11	state harbors to defray the cost of harbor infrastructure
12	improvements incurred within the State.
13	(f) All procurements relating to the harbors modernization
14	project shall be exempt from chapter 103D until June 30, 2017.
15	(g) The harbors modernization group shall cease to exist
16	when the harbors modernization project is completed.
17	§266- Appointment of executive director; appointment of
18	staff. The harbors modernization group shall appoint and set
19	the salary of an executive director, who shall be exempt from
20	chapters 76 and 89, and shall serve at the pleasure of the
21	harbors modernization group.

1	The e	executive director may appoint, without regard to
2	chapters '	76 and 89, and at pleasure dismiss persons as the
3	executive	director finds necessary for the performance of the
4	functions	of the harbors modernization group and fix their
5	compensat:	ion; provided that any person, who is a civil service
6	appointmen	nt on the staff of the harbors modernization group as
7	of June 30	0, 2010 shall be transferred under the executive
8	director	in accordance with law."
9		PART IV
10	SECT	ION 6. Notwithstanding any law to the contrary:
11	(1)	The two public members from the maritime industry, who
12		were serving on the harbors modernization group under
13		appointments effective on the day before the effective
14		date of this Act, shall continue to serve on the
15		harbors modernization group in the capacity of public
16		members from the maritime industry; and
17	(2)	The service of all other members on the harbors
18		modernization group as of the day before the effective
19		date of this Act shall terminate on the day before the
20		effective date of this Act.
21	SECT:	ION 7. All appropriations, records, equipment,
22	machines,	files, supplies, contracts, books, papers, documents,
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- 1 maps, and other personal property heretofore made, used,
- 2 acquired, or held by the Aloha Tower development corporation
- 3 with regard to harbor projects and development relating to the
- 4 functions transferred to the department of transportation shall
- 5 be transferred with the functions to which they relate.
- 6 SECTION 8. There is appropriated out of the general
- 7 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 8 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2010-2011 for
- 9 the compensation of the newly appointed executive director and
- 10 the staff of the harbors modernization group, as well as
- 11 consultant services to implement the commercial harbors
- 12 modernization plan.
- 13 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 14 transportation for the purposes of this Act.
- 15 SECTION 9. New statutory material is underscored.
- 16 SECTION 10. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2010.
