A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SCHOOLS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Scientists predict that the world is due for an 2 influenza pandemic – a global outbreak from a new strain of 3 influenza. The United States Department of Education is 4 collaborating with health experts and agencies across the 5 federal government to ensure that, in the case of pandemic flu, 6 operations and services will continue. State and local 7 preparedness will be crucial in preventing the spread of disease. Because schools are centers of community life, 8 9 educators and administrators should work with local officials to 10 make planning for pandemic flu, or other pandemic, a priority. 11 Strategies and plans must be developed to assist in 12 disseminating health information, planning for staff and student 13 absences, and maintaining a learning environment.

14 The purpose of this Act is to provide for the public health 15 and safety by requiring every school to develop its own pandemic 16 preparedness plan and post the plan on the department of 17 education's website.
