A BILL FOR AN ACT

PROPOSING AN AMENDMENT TO ARTICLE III, SECTION 4, OF THE CONSTITUTION OF THE STATE OF HAWAII TO IMPOSE TERM LIMITS UPON STATE REPRESENTATIVES AND SENATORS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to propose an
2	amendment to article III, section 4, of the Constitution of the
3	State of Hawaii to limit state representatives to six
4	consecutive two-year terms and state senators to three
5	consecutive four-year terms.
6	SECTION 2. Article III, section 4, of the Constitution of
7	the State of Hawaii, is amended to read as follows:

9	Section 4. Each member of the legislature shall be elected

1 general election at which elected or if elected at a primary 2 election, on the day of the general election immediately 3 following the primary election at which elected. For a member 4 of the house of representatives, the terms shall end on the day 5 of the general election immediately following the day the 6 member's term commences. For a member of the senate, the term 7 shall end on the day of the second general election immediately 8 following the day the member's term commences." 9 SECTION 3. The question to be printed on the ballot shall 10 be as follows: 11 "Shall state representatives be limited to serving six 12 consecutive two-year terms, and shall state senators be 13 limited to serving three consecutive four-year terms, 14 beginning with terms commencing on the day of the general 15 election of 2010; provided that a person may serve in the 16 same position again if the person has been out of that 17 office for at least four years?" 18 SECTION 4. Constitutional material to be repealed is

19 bracketed and stricken. New constitutional material is 20 underscored.
