## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO JUSTIFIABLE USE OF FORCE.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 703-304, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 "\$703-304 Use of force in self-protection. (1) Subject
- 4 to the provisions of this section and of section 703-308, the
- 5 use of force upon or toward another person is justifiable when
- 6 the actor believes that such force is immediately necessary for
- 7 the purpose of protecting himself against the use of unlawful
- 8 force by the other person on the present occasion.
- 9 (2) The use of deadly force is justifiable under this
- 10 section if the actor believes that deadly force is necessary to
- 11 protect himself against death, serious bodily injury,
- 12 kidnapping, rape, or forcible sodomy.
- 13 (3) Except as otherwise provided in subsections (4) and
- 14 (5) of this section, a person employing protective force may
- 15 estimate the necessity thereof under the circumstances as he
- 16 believes them to be when the force is used without retreating,

6	soon as he knows that he safely can, unless the person confined		
7	has been arrested on a charge of crime."		
8	SECTION 2. Section 703-305, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
9	amended to read as follows:		
10	"§703-305 Use of force for the protection of other		
11	<b>persons.</b> $[\frac{(1)}{(1)}]$ Subject to the provisions of this section and		
12	of section 703-310, the use of force upon or toward the person		
13	of another is justifiable to protect a third person when:		
14	$[\frac{a}{a}]$ Under the circumstances as the actor believes them		
15	to be, the person whom the actor seeks to protect		
16	would be justified in using such protective force; and		
17	[ <del>(b)</del> ] <u>(2)</u> The actor believes that the actor's intervention		
18	is necessary for the protection of the other person.		
19	(2) Notwithstanding subsection (1):		
20	(a) When the actor would be obliged under section 703-304		
21	to retreat, to surrender the possession of a thing, or		
22	to comply with a demand before using force in self-

1		protection, the actor is not obliged to do so before
2		using force for the protection of another person,
3		unless the actor knows that the actor can thereby
4		secure the complete safety of such other person; and
5	<del>(d)</del>	When the person whom the actor seeks to protect would
6		be obliged under section 703-304 to retreat, to
7		surrender the possession of a thing or to comply with
8		a demand if the person knew that the person could
9		obtain complete safety by so doing, the actor is
10		obliged to try to cause the person to do so before
11		using force in the person's protection if the actor
12		knows that the actor can obtain the other's complete
13		safety in that way; and
14	<del>(c)</del>	Neither the actor nor the person whom the actor seeks
15		to protect is obliged to retreat when in the other's
16		dwelling or place of work to any greater extent than
17		in the actor's or the person's own.]"
18	SECT	ION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
19	and stric	ken. New statutory material is underscored.
20	SECT	ION 4. This Act does not affect rights and duties tha
21	matured,	penalties that were incurred, and proceeding that were
22	begun, be	fore its effective date.
