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A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO OCEAN RECREATION AND COASTAL AREAS PROGRAMS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 200-37, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
 amended to read as follows:

3 "\$200-37 Operation of thrill craft; parasailing; water
4 sledding; commercial high speed boating. (a) No person shall
5 operate a thrill craft unless the person is fifteen years of age
6 or older.

7 (b) The department shall adopt rules to designate areas
8 where, and time periods during which, thrill craft may be
9 operated and parasailing, water sledding, and commercial high
10 speed boating may be engaged in.

11 (c) No person shall operate a thrill craft in the waters 12 of the State, except:

13 (1) In areas and during time periods designated by the14 department; and

15 (2) Through areas designated by the department to serve as16 avenues for the ingress and egress of thrill craft

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1		between the areas designated under paragraph (1) and
2		the shore.
3	(d)	No person shall:
4	(1)	Engage in parasailing; or
5	(2)	Operate a motorized vessel towing a person engaged in
6		parasailing;
7	on or abo	ve the waters of the State, except on or above areas
8	and durin	g time periods designated by the department.
9	(e)	No person shall:
10	(1)	Engage in water sledding; or
11	(2)	Operate a motorized vessel towing a person engaged in
12		water sledding;
13	in the wa	ters of the State, except in areas and during time
14	periods d	esignated by the department.
15	(f)	No person shall engage in commercial high speed
16	boating o	r operate an open power boat capable of exceeding forty
17	miles per	hour for commercial high speed boating purposes in the
18	waters of	the State, except:
19	(1)	In areas, along routes, and during time periods
20		designated by the department; and
21	(2)	In accordance with a permit issued by the department.

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(g) During all weekends and state and federal holidays, no
 commercial operator shall operate a thrill craft, or engage in
 parasailing, water sledding, or commercial high speed boating,
 or operate a motor vessel towing a person engaged in water
 sledding or parasailing in Maunalua Bay on Oahu as provided for
 in section 200-38.

7 (h) On Sundays, all commercial ocean recreation
8 activities, including those listed in this section, shall be
9 prohibited on Oahu in Maunalua Bay as provided for in section
10 200-38.

(i) Between December 15 and May 15 of each year, no person shall operate a thrill craft, or engage in parasailing, water sledding, or commercial high speed boating, or operate a motor vessel towing a person engaged in water sledding or parasailing on the west and south shore of Maui as provided in section 200-38.

(j) All commercial use and operator permits issued by the department for commercial thrill craft, and parasailing activities shall be fully transferable upon the payment of a business transfer fee in an amount determined by the department, which shall be no greater than six per cent of the transfer price; provided that no more than one transfer every two years SB367 SD1.DOC *SB367 SD1.DOC* *SB367 SD1.DOC*

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shall be authorized with respect to any given permit, except
 transfers between family members for the purpose of business
 reorganization.

4 The department may immediately revoke a commercial use (k) 5 permit without a hearing for any activity that endangers or may 6 endanger the health or safety of passengers or the public, and 7 may suspend or revoke a commercial use permit for violation of any rules of the department if, after seventy-two hours notice 8 9 by the department of the violation, the permit holder fails to 10 cure the violation; provided that the permit holder shall have 11 ten days from receipt of the notice of suspension or revocation 12 to request in writing an administrative hearing. The 13 administrative hearing is solely for the purpose of allowing the 14 permit holder to contest the basis for the suspension or 15 revocation of the permit. The hearing shall be held within five 16 working days of the department's receipt of the written request. 17 The chairperson shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter 91 to 18 implement the procedures governing the administrative hearing 19 process. Within ten days after the conclusion of the hearing, 20 the department shall either:

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(1) Lift the suspension;

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1 (2) Suspend the permit for a period of not longer than one 2 year; or 3 Revoke the permit. (3) 4 (1) All new commercial use and operator permits issued by 5 the department for commercial thrill craft, and parasailing 6 activities after June 18, 1996 shall be issued at public 7 auction. 8 Each commercial use and operator permit issued by the (m) 9 department for commercial thrill craft, and parasailing 10 activities shall be valid for five years from the date of 11 issuance and shall be renewed by the department for additional 12 five-year periods[, not to exceed a maximum of twenty years;]; 13 provided that the permit holder shall have met the following conditions: 14 15 The permit holder shall be in compliance with all (1)16 applicable rules of the department; 17 The permit holder shall have timely filed and paid all (2) 18 applicable state taxes during the year; and 19 The permit holder shall have a good safety record (3) 20 regarding the operation of a commercial thrill craft, 21 or parasailing activity.

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1	[(n) Upon expiration of the twenty-year period, the permit		
2	may be offered for public auction as provided in this chapter;		
3	provided that the previous permit holder shall be offered the		
4	right of first refusal in accordance with departmental rules;		
5	and provided further that the permit holder shall agree to match		
6	the highest bid offered at the public auction.]		
7	[(0)] <u>(n)</u> All commercial use and operator permits issued		
8	by the department for commercial thrill craft, and parasailing		
9	activities shall be subject to an annual review by the		
10	department which shall include but not be limited to:		
11	(1) The permit holder's compliance with applicable rules		
12	of the department;		
13	(2) The permit holder's timely filing and payment of all		
14	applicable state taxes during the year; and		
15	(3) The permit holder's safety record regarding the		
16	operation of a commercial thrill craft, or parasailing		
17	activity.		
18	[(p)] <u>(o)</u> The department shall adopt rules to encourage		
19	water safety education and programs with respect to thrill		
20	craft, or parasailing activities."		
21	SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed		
22	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.		
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1 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
