A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FISHING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. In recent years, the number of uhu and goatfish
- 2 found on reefs surrounding the island of Maui has declined. The
- 3 popularity of uhu and goatfish as food fish has led to over-
- 4 harvesting on the island of Maui and has made harvesting these
- 5 fish for food difficult.
- 6 There are eight species of uhu (family Scaridae) in Hawaii.
- 7 Also known as parrotfish, once commonly found on reefs
- 8 surrounding Maui, uhu is the most prolific contributor of sand
- 9 production of all Hawaiian reef fishes.
- 10 The redlip uhu (Scarus rubroviolaceus), also known as uhu
- 11 palukaluka, the stareye uhu (Calotomus carolinus), also known as
- 12 ponuhunuhu, the spectacled uhu (Chlorurus perspicillatus), also
- 13 known as uhu uliuli (male) and uhu'ahu'ula (female), are the
- 14 preferred species for eating.
- 15 There are also five other types of uhu, the yellowbar uhu
- 16 (Calotomus zonarchus), bullethead uhu (Chlorurus sordidus),
- 17 regal uhu (Scarus dubius), spinytooth uhu (Calotomus spinidens)

- ${f 1}$ and palenose uhu (Scarus psittacus). The spectacled, yellowbar,
- 2 and regal uhus are endemic to Hawaii.
- 3 There are several species of goatfish (family Mullidae) in
- 4 Hawaii. The three species most sought after as a food fish are
- 5 the white saddle goatfish (Parupeneus porphyreus), also known as
- 6 kumu, the blue goatfish (Parupeneus cyclostomus), also known as
- 7 moano ukali, and the double bar goatfish (Parupeneus
- 8 bifasciatus), also known as munu, commonly found on reefs
- 9 surrounding Maui. This family of fish is highly prized as a
- 10 food fish and cherished by many ethnic cultures.
- 11 Although uhu can be harvested year-round, the regal uhu,
- 12 palenose uhu, redlip uhu, bullethead uhu, and the spectacled
- 13 uhu, require a minimum length of twelve inches by measure of
- 14 fork length (the distance from the fish's mouth or snout to the
- 15 fork of the tail) to be legally harvested in Hawaii. Although
- 16 kumu can be harvested year-round, the white saddle goatfish must
- 17 have a minimum length of ten inches by measure of fork length to
- 18 be legally harvested in Hawaii. The moano ukali and munu are
- 19 unregulated species and currently have no size restrictions.
- 20 The purpose of this Act is to require a bag limit for uhu
- 21 and goatfish to no more than two each of kumu, moano ukali,

- 1 munu, and uhu per person, per day, for recreational,
- 2 subsistence, or commercial purposes on the island of Maui.
- 3 This Act also provides for exemptions and creates minimum
- 4 size limits for all species of uhu, kumu, moano ukali, and munu.
- 5 SECTION 2. Chapter 188, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 6 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 7 and to read as follows:
- 8 "\$188- Uhu; goatfish; bag limit. (a) It shall be
- 9 unlawful for any person to take, possess, or sell more than two
- 10 kumu, two moano ukali, or two munu per day on Maui; provided
- 11 that a commercial marine dealer may possess and sell more than
- 12 two kumu, two moano ukali, and two munu, with receipts issued
- 13 for the purchase pursuant to section 189-11.
- (b) It shall be unlawful for any person to take, possess,
- 15 or sell any kumu, moano ukali, or munu less than ten inches in
- 16 length on Maui.
- 17 (c) It shall be unlawful for any person to take, possess,
- 18 or sell more than two uhu per day on Maui; provided that a
- 19 commercial marine dealer may possess and sell more than two uhu
- 20 with receipts issued for the purchase pursuant to section
- **21** 189-11.

    of the snout to the middle of the trailing edge of the tail.

         "Maui" means the entire island of Maui, including its state

    marine waters.
         "Moano ukali" means any fish known as Parupeneus

         "Munu" means any fish known as Parupeneus bifasciatus or
