A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO AGRICULTURAL LANDS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. In 2005, the legislature enacted Act 183,
- 2 Session Laws of Hawaii 2005, implementing article XI, section 3,
- 3 of the state constitution regarding important agricultural
- 4 lands. Act 183 establishes policies and procedures for the
- 5 identification of important agricultural lands and provides for
- 6 a process to develop protection and incentive measures for
- 7 important agricultural lands and agricultural viability.
- 8 Between 1969 and 2006, the amount of land zoned for agriculture
- 9 declined by over twenty-five thousand acres statewide, according
- 10 to the Hawai'i Data Book. On O'ahu alone, land under cultivation
- 11 went from one hundred twenty-five thousand acres in 1982 to
- 12 seventy thousand acres in 2005, according to the Statistics of
- 13 Hawai'i Agriculture compiled by the state department of
- 14 agriculture. On O'ahu, there is particular concern regarding
- 15 housing projects that threaten vital agricultural lands in
- 16 Mokule'ia and Kahuku.

1	The purpose of this Act is to establish a five-year		
2	moratoriu	m on the development of agricultural lands located in	
3	the area	bounded by Wahiawa, Ka'ena Point, and Kahuku, on the	
4	North Shore of O'ahu for which general planning has not		
5	commenced.		
6	SECTION 2. (a) Notwithstanding any law to the contrary,		
7	there is	established a five-year moratorium on any building or	
8	development project on agricultural lands located in state		
9	representative district forty-six; provided that:		
10	(1)	The moratorium on building or development projects on	
11		agricultural lands shall be limited to any building or	
12		development project for which general planning has not	
13		commerced;	
14	(2)	The building or development project is intended to	
15		affect parcels of agricultural land with an overall	
16		(master) productivity rating of class A or B, and	
17		designated as an agricultural district;	
18	(3)	The building or development project is intended to	
19		affect parcels of agricultural land located in the	
20		State of Hawaii, and designated as an agricultural	
21		district; and	

1	(4) The building or development project is not a		
2	permissible use within an agricultural district under		
3	section 205-4.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes.		
4	(b) The moratorium shall be lifted on June 30, 2014.		
5	(c) For purposes of this section, "general planning" means		
6	projects for which a permit application has been submitted to		
7	the appropriate state or county agency for processing and		
8	visible construction has already commenced.		
9	SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2009.
