RELATING TO THE PENAL CODE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. This Act shall be known as the "Protect Victims 2 of Domestic Violence Act". SECTION 2. Section 707-701, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 3 4 amended by amending subsection (1) to read as follows: A person commits the offense of murder in the first 5 "(1) 6 degree if the person intentionally or knowingly causes the death 7 of: 8 More than one person in the same or separate incident; (a) 9 A law enforcement officer, judge, or prosecutor (b) arising out of the performance of official duties; 10 11 (C) A person known by the defendant to be a witness in a 12 criminal prosecution and the killing is related to the person's status as a witness; 13 A person by a hired killer, in which event both the 14 (d) 15 person hired and the person responsible for hiring the 16 killer shall be punished under this section; [or] 17 A person while the defendant was imprisoned [-]; (e)
