A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO WORKS OF ART SPECIAL FUND.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. Section 6E-35, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by	y amending subsection (c) to read as follows:
3	" (C)	To receive state funds, including funds under section
4	103-8.5,	the State of Hawaii Museum of Monarchy History shall:
5	(1)	Be licensed or accredited, in accordance with federal,
6		state, or county statutes, rules, or ordinances, to
7		conduct the activities or provide the services for
8		which funds are appropriated;
9	(2)	Comply with all applicable federal and state laws
10		prohibiting discrimination against any person on the
11	· · · · · ·	basis of race, color, national origin, religion,
12		creed, sex, age, sexual orientation, or disability;
13	(3)	Agree not to use the funds for entertainment or
14		lobbying activities;
15	(4)	Be incorporated under the laws of the State;

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1 (5) Have bylaws or policies that describe the manner in 2 which the activities or services for which a grant or 3 subsidy is awarded shall be conducted or provided; 4 (6) Have been determined and designated to be a tax-exempt 5 organization by the Internal Revenue Service; and 6 Have a governing board whose members shall have no (7) 7 material conflict of interest and serve without 8 compensation." 9 SECTION 2. Section 6E-40, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 10 amended to read as follows: 11 "§6E-40 Bernice Pauahi Bishop Museum. The official 12 designation of the Bernice Pauahi Bishop Museum shall be the 13 State of Hawaii Museum of Natural and Cultural History. The 14 qualifying standards and conditions related to the receipt of 15 funds contained in chapter 42F shall not apply to funds received by the State of Hawaii Museum of Natural and Cultural History; 16 17 provided that if the museum in turn contracts with a recipient 18 or provider, then the qualifying standards, conditions, and 19 other provisions of chapter 42F shall apply to the recipient or 20 provider and the contract.

21 The Bernice Pauahi Bishop Museum may receive funds from the
22 works of art special fund established by section 103-8.5."



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1	SECT	ION 3. Section 103-8.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended a	s follows:
3	1.	By amending subsection (b) to read as follows:
4	"(b)	The works of art special fund shall be used solely
5	for the f	ollowing purposes:
6	(1)	Costs related to the acquisition of works of art,
7		including any consultant or staff services required to
8		carry out the art in public places and relocatable
9		works of art programs;
10	(2)	Site modifications, display, and interpretive work
11		necessary for the exhibition of works of art;
12	(3)	Upkeep services, including maintenance, repair, and
13		restoration of works of art;
14	(4)	Storing and transporting works of art[-]; and
15	(5)	Costs related to the acquisition, display, disposal,
16		upkeep, maintenance, repair, and restoration of works
17		of art, artifacts, or historical buildings, for the:
18		(A) Iolani Palace, as provided under section 6E-35;
19		and
20		(B) Bernice Pauahi Bishop Museum, as provided under
21		section 6E-40."



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1	2. By amending subsections (d), (e), and (f) to read as		
2	follows:		
3	"(d) [The] For purposes of subsection (b), the		
4	comptroller and the [state]:		
5	(1) State foundation on culture and the arts [shall] with		
6	respect to works of art in public places;		
7	(2) State of Hawaii Museum of Monarchy History with		
8	respect to works of art, artifacts, and projects for		
9	upkeep of historical buildings for the Iolani Palace;		
10	and		
11	(3) Bernice Pauahi Bishop Museum with respect to works of		
12	art, artifacts, and projects for the upkeep of		
13	historical buildings for the museum;		
14	shall decide on the specific art objects or artifacts, as		
15	applicable, to acquire, giving first consideration to placing		
16	appropriate pieces of art at the locations of the original		
17	appropriation $[-,]$ for placement of works of art in public places,		
18	as well as decide on the specific projects for the upkeep of		
19	historical buildings. Acquisition and placement of pieces of		
20	art and artifacts in the Bernice Pauahi Bishop Museum and the		
21	Iolani Palace shall be solely determined by that museum or the		
22	Iolani Palace, as applicable.		



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1	The selection of, commissioning artists for, reviewing of		
2	design, execution, and placement of, and the acceptance of works		
3	of art in public places shall be the responsibility of the		
4	comptroller and the state foundation on culture and the arts in		
5	consultation with the affected agency or department.		
6	The selection of works of art and artifacts, not including		
7	the commissioning of artists, for the Iolani Palace and the		
8	Bernice Pauahi Bishop Museum shall be the responsibility of the		
9	comptroller and the State of Hawaii Museum of Monarchy History		
10	or the Bernice Pauahi Bishop Museum, as applicable.		
11	Expenditures from the works of art special fund shall be		
12	made by the comptroller. The Iolani Palace and the Bernice		
13	Pauahi Bishop Museum shall be entitled to expenditures from the		
14	works of art special fund, notwithstanding the absence of one		
15	per cent transfer of moneys into the fund under subsection (a)		
16	from these entities. The comptroller shall adopt rules pursuant		
17	to chapter 91 necessary for purposes of expenditures from the		
18	works of art special fund to the Iolani Palace and the Bernice		
19	Pauahi Bishop Museum.		
20	(e) The comptroller shall:		
21	(1) Provide each agency receiving capital improvement

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1		shall be included and excluded from the one per cent	
2		amount;	
3	(2)	Ensure that each agency calculates its one per cent	
4		amount correctly; and	
5	(3)	Ensure that each agency transfers the correct amount	
6		to the works of art special fund in a timely manner.	
7	The Berni	ce Pauahi Bishop Museum and the Iolani Palace shall be	
8	exempt fr	om this subsection.	
9	(f)	The comptroller and the executive director shall track	
10	amounts d	ue from each agency, except the Bernice Pauahi Bishop	
11	Museum and the Iolani Palace, under the one per cent requirement		
12	as provided in this section."
