BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 235, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated 3 and to read as follows: 4 Organ donation; tax deduction. (a) There shall "§235-5 be allowed to every individual taxpayer as a deduction from 6 adjusted gross income, an amount not to exceed \$10,000, to cover 7 any expenses incurred by the taxpayer that are the direct result 8 of donation by the taxpayer of the taxpayer's organ. 9 To qualify for the deduction, the taxpayer donor shall 10 have been alive at the time of the donation, a full-time 11 resident of the State, and donated one or more of the taxpayer 12 donor's organs to another human being for organ transplantation. 13 (c) A taxpayer may claim the deduction under this section 14 only in a taxable year in which an unreimbursed expense was 15 incurred and only for the following unreimbursed expenses: 16 (1) Travel expenses;
