### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ELECTIONS.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 12-6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
 amended to read as follows:

3 "§12-6 Nomination papers: time for filing; fees. (a)
4 Nomination papers shall be filed as follows:

5 For members of Congress, state, and county offices, (1)6 nomination papers shall be filed with the chief election officer, or clerk in case of county offices, 7 8 not later than 4:30 p.m. on the [sixtieth] eightieth 9 calendar day prior to the primary, special primary, or 10 special election provided that if such day is a 11 Saturday, Sunday, or holiday then not later than 4:30 12 p.m. on the first working day immediately preceding. 13 A state candidate from the counties of Hawaii, Maui, 14 and Kauai may file the declaration of candidacy with 15 the respective clerk. The clerk shall transmit to the 16 office of the chief election officer the state 17 candidate's declaration of candidacy without delay. 18 However, if a special primary or special election is



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1		to be held by a county and the county charter requires
2		that the council shall issue a proclamation calling
3		for the election to be held within a specified period
4		of time, and if that requirement would not allow the
5		filing of nomination papers with the appropriate
6		office by the [ <del>sixtieth</del> ] <u>eightieth</u> calendar day prior
7		to the day for holding the special primary or special
8		election, the council shall establish the deadline for
9		the filing of nomination papers in the proclamation
10		calling for the election; and
11	(2)	For the board of trustees for the office of Hawaiian
12		affairs, nomination papers shall be filed with the
13		chief election officer, not later than 4:30 p.m. on
14		the [ <del>sixtieth</del> ] <u>eightieth</u> calendar day prior to the
15		primary election referred to in paragraph (1);
16		provided that if that day is a Saturday, Sunday, or
17		holiday, then not later than 4:30 p.m. on the first
18		working day immediately preceding.

20	candidate	s who have filed nomination papers for an elective

22 held in conjunction with the primary election, the chief



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election officer or clerk, in the case of a county election,
 shall accept nomination papers for that office not later than
 4:30 p.m. on the [fiftieth] seventieth day prior to the primary,
 special primary, or special election.

5	(c)(1)	If any candidate for Congress, state, or county office
6		should withdraw their nomination papers seventy-two
7		hours before the filing deadline and as a result
8		create an uncontested race for that office, then the
9	X	filing deadline for that certain office shall be
10		extended by five calendar days, provided that if such
11		day is a Saturday, Sunday, or holiday then not later
12		than 4:30 p.m. on the first working day immediately
13		preceding. This provision shall also apply to an
14		uncontested race in which the incumbent does not file
15		nomination papers and by doing so creates an unopposed
16		contest for the remaining candidate in that office.
17	(2)	Any office left either without any candidate or with
18		an uncontested election as a direct result of a
19		candidate or candidates for that office opting to file
20		for the contest opened up by this initial five
21		calendar day extension shall be granted the following:
22		Candidates wishing to file for this office shall be



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1		granted a five calendar day extension from the date
2		the office is left either uncontested or without a
3		candidate, provided that if such day is a Saturday,
4		Sunday, or holiday, then not later than 4:30 p.m. on
5		the first working day immediately preceding. This
6		extension shall be granted for each office that
7		subsequently is affected by withdrawals qualified in
8		this provision, provided that no extension shall be
9		granted after the fiftieth calendar day prior to the
10		primary, special primary, or special election.

12	nomination	n paper a filing fee on account of the expenses
13	attending	the holding of the primary, special primary, or
14	special e	lection which shall be paid into the treasury of the
15	State, or	county, as the case may be, as a realization:
16	(1)	For United States senators and United States
17		representatives\$75;
18	(2)	For governor and lieutenant governor\$750;
19	(3)	For mayor\$500; and
20	(4)	For all other offices\$250.

3	hour, and minute when it was received shall be endorsed thereon.

5	affidavit which has been filed with the campaign spending				
6	commission pursuant to section 11-208 by a candidate who has				
7	voluntarily agreed to abide by spending limits, the chief				
8	election officer or clerk shall discount the filing fee of the				
9	candidate by the following amounts:				
10	(1) For the office of governor and lieutenant governor				
11	\$675;				
12	(2) For the office of mayor\$450; and				
13	(3) For all other offices\$225.				
14	$\left[\frac{\left(f\right)}{\left(g\right)}\right]$ The chief election officer or clerk shall				
15	waive the filing fee in the case of a person who declares, by				
16	affidavit, that the person is indigent and who has filed a				
17	petition signed by currently registered voters who constitute at				
18	least one-half of one per cent of the total voters registered at				
19	the last preceding general election in the respective district				
20	or districts which correspond to the specific office for which				
21	the indigent person is a candidate. This petition shall be				
22	submitted on the form prescribed and provided by the chief				
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1 election officer together with the nomination paper required by this chapter." 2 Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 3 SECTION 2. and stricken.
