A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CORRECTIONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature believes that the State would
 benefit from a less-expensive alternative to incarceration, such
 as the electronic monitoring of non-violent committed persons
 who are permitted to live and work in the community. The
 purpose of this Act is to establish and fund an electronic
 monitoring pilot program for eligible committed persons.

7 SECTION 2. (a) By not later than , the 8 department of public safety shall establish and administer an 9 electronic monitoring pilot program on Oahu for eligible 10 committed persons. Program participants shall be permitted to live and work in the community and shall be electronically 11 12 monitored by the department at all times. To electronically 13 monitor the participating committed persons, the department 14 shall use global positioning satellite tracking devices designed 15 to transmit and record the participant's location data.



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1	(b)	To be eligible to participate in the electronic
2	monitoring	g pilot program, a committed person, at the time of
3	admission	to the program, shall:
4	(1)	Be considered non-violent, as determined by the
5		department;
6	(2)	Have not more than thirty-six months remaining on the
7		person's sentence;
8	(3)	Be a model or near-model inmate, as determined by the
9		department;
10	(4)	Have served at least fifty per cent of the committed
11		person's sentence; and
12	(5)	Submit to electronic monitoring.
13	(C)	The department shall design and implement a pilot
14	program th	nat requires participants to:
15	(1)	Submit to drug testing once each week;
16	(2)	Maintain employment of no less than twenty hours per
17		week within twelve weeks of beginning the program;
18	(3)	Secure housing prior to and during participation in
19		the program;
20	(4)	Identify at least two persons, in addition to any
21		pilot program or department employees or contractors,



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1		who shall provide assistance and guidance and other
2		support as needed to the participant;
3	(5)	Enroll and successfully complete any rehabilitation,
4		treatment, education, or other program as required by
5		the department; and
6	(6)	Participate in at least one community service project
7		each quarter, which shall be approved by the
8		department in advance.
9	(d)	Notwithstanding any other law, persons convicted of
10	violating	the following provisions shall not be eligible to
11	participate in the electronic monitoring pilot program:	
12	sections 707-1, 707-1.5, 707-710, 707-711, 708-810, 708-820,	
13	708-840,	708-841, 708-8251, 709-906, and part V of chapter 707,
14	Hawaii Revised Statutes.	
15	(e)	The department shall select the program participants,
16	subject to	o the approval of the prosecuting attorney of the
17	county in which the committed person was convicted. The program	
18	shall be	limited to a maximum of fifty participants at any time.
19	(f)	A program participant who fails a drug test shall be
20	required	to undergo drug treatment and counseling. A
21	participa	nt who fails two drug tests while participating in the



program shall immediately become ineligible to participate in
 the program and shall be placed in a correctional facility.

3 (g) An electronic monitoring program participant who is
4 arrested for committing a crime shall immediately become
5 ineligible to participate in the program and shall be processed
6 through the law enforcement and the judicial systems, as
7 necessary.

8 (h) The department may adopt rules pursuant to chapter 919 to effectuate this Act.

SECTION 3. The department of public safety shall submit a report to the legislature concerning the status of the electronic monitoring pilot program and make findings and recommendations, including whether to continue the pilot program, not later than twenty days prior to the convening of the regular session of 2011.

16 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general 17 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so 18 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2009-2010 and 19 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal 20 year 2010-2011 to establish and implement the electronic 21 monitoring pilot program for eligible committed persons.



The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
 of public safety for the purposes of this Act.

3 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2009.
