A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE HAWAIIAN LANGUAGE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the Constitution of the State of Hawai'i provides for the preservation and promotion of native Hawaiian culture, history, and language. For example,
- 4 article X, section 4, provides that, "[t]he State shall promote
- 5 the study of Hawaiian culture, history and language." Article
- 6 XII, section 7, Constitution of the State of Hawaii, provides,
- 7 "[t]he State reaffirms and shall protect all rights, customarily
- $oldsymbol{8}$ and traditionally exercised for subsistence, cultural and
- 9 religious purposes . . . " of native Hawaiians. Because
- 10 maintaining a living language is an integral component of
- 11 preserving a culture, it is also important to note that article
- 12 XV, section 4, of the Constitution of the State of Hawaii,
- 13 reestablishes that "English and Hawaiian shall be the official
- 14 languages of Hawaii "
- 15 Since 1978, when the State reaffirmed Hawaiian as one of
- 16 its official languages, the legislature has backed efforts to
- 17 incorporate the language into official state writings, emblems,

- 1 and signs. Ensuring that these public inscriptions are
- 2 mandatory, accurate, and spelled correctly, and use of the
- 3 proper Hawaiian macrons and glottal stops not only shows the
- 4 deserved respect for the native language of these islands, but
- 5 also fully comports with the intent and words of the state
- 6 constitution.
- 7 The purpose of this Act is to ensure the constitutionally-
- 8 and ethically-mandated preservation of the native Hawaiian
- 9 language and culture by requiring that all state and county
- 10 documents, letterheads, symbols, and emblems, when newly
- 11 created, replaced, or reprinted, contain the accurate,
- 12 appropriate, and authentic Hawaiian names and language.
- 13 SECTION 2. Section 1-13.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 14 amended to read as follows:
- "[+] §1-13.5[+] Hawaiian language; spelling. [Macrons and
- 16 glottal stops may be used in the spelling of words or terms in
- 17 the Hawaiian language in] (a) Effective January 1, 2011, all
- 18 documents and letterhead prepared by or for state or county
- 19 agencies or officials [-] shall include the accurate,
- 20 appropriate, and authentic Hawaiian names and language,
- 21 including proper Hawaiian spelling and punctuation, including
- 22 but not limited to macrons and glottal stops, printed above the

1 English translation; provided that any revision to conform any document or letterhead existing on or before January 1, 2011 to 2 3 the requirements of this section, may be implemented when the 4 document or letterhead requires replacement or reprinting, or 5 otherwise requires revision. Any rule, order, policy, or other act, official or otherwise, that prohibits or discourages the 6 7 use of [these symbols] proper Hawaiian punctuation or spelling 8 shall be void. 9 (b) The Hawaiian language shall be accurate, appropriate, and authentic when printed in conformance with: 10 11 (1) "Hawaiian Dictionary: Hawaiian-English, English-12 Hawaiian", by Mary Kawena Pukui and Samuel H. Elbert, 13 University of Hawaii Press, copyright 1986; or 14 (2) "Māmaka Kaiao: A Modern Hawaiian Vocabulary", developed by Kōmike Hua'olelo, the Hawaiian Lexicon 15 16 Committee." 17 SECTION 3. Section 5-6.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended to read as follows: 18 "[+] §5-6.5[+] State language. (a) The Hawaiian language 19 20 is the native language of Hawaii and [may], effective January 1, 21 2011, shall be used on all emblems and symbols representative of the State, its departments, agencies, and political 22

- subdivisions [-]; provided that for emblems and symbols existing 1
- on January 1, 2011, conformance with this section may be delayed 2
- until a replacement for the emblem or symbol otherwise is 3
- required. 4
- 5 The Hawaiian language as used on all emblems and (b)
- 6 symbols shall be in conformance with the requirements of
- 7 subsection 1-13.5(b)."
- 8 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 9 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval. 10
