2 the premises. Any authorized person who enters premises for the  
3 purpose of removing graffiti pursuant to this section shall not  
4 be liable for civil damages resulting from the authorized  
5 person's acts or omissions in entering the premises to remove  
6 graffiti, except for such damages as may result from the  
7 authorized person's gross negligence or wanton acts or  
8 omissions."

9 SECTION 2. The attorney general shall establish a program,  
10 in cooperation with the chief of police of the respective  
11 counties, to catalog and make available to the public via the  
12 Internet or other appropriate means images of graffiti "tags" to  
13 assist in identifying graffiti "taggers".

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**Report Title:**

Graffiti; Eradication

**Description:**

Authorizes limited access by designated state or county agencies limited to private real property for the purpose of painting over graffiti if owner or occupant of the property has not painted over the graffiti within 30 days after notice to do so. Requires the attorney general to create an internet-based library of graffiti tags to assist in identifying graffiti taggers.
