A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ELECTIONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds the 2008 nomination 2 period for elective office led to chaos and controversy. When a 3 last minute candidacy for the Honolulu mayoral campaign was 4 announced, it resulted in an available city council seat. In 5 the race to file nomination papers, a state representative seat 6 was made available. News accounts told of people obtaining 7 nomination papers within thirty minutes of the filing deadline. Candidates scrambled to find signatures for nomination papers 8 9 and the elections office was in such a state of confusion, state 10 Democratic party leaders intervened to persuade officials to 11 allow candidates to collect signatures and file nomination 12 papers five minutes prior to the filing deadline. The State's 13 chief election officer later invalidated the candidacy.

In the city clerk's office after invalidating a city
council nomination, the clerk felt compelled to have late
decisions referred to the city ethics commission for review to

improve procedures and ensure that the office is in compliance
 with city standards of conduct.

In response to the controversial decisions resulting from a confusing and chaotic nomination period, the Honolulu city council on September 24, 2008, adopted a resolution urging the legislature to require that nomination papers for elective office be obtained at least twenty-four hours prior to the filing deadline.

9 The purpose of this Act is to establish a statutory
10 deadline by which a person seeking candidacy for elective office
11 must obtain nomination papers.

12 SECTION 2. Section 12-2.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 13 amended to read as follows:

14 "§12-2.5 Nomination papers; when available. (a)
15 Nomination papers shall be made available from the first working
16 day of February in every even-numbered year; provided that in
17 the case of a special primary or special election, nomination
18 papers shall be made available at least ten days prior to the
19 close of filing.

20 (b) Nomination papers shall not be available within
21 twenty-four hours prior to the close of filing for any elective
22 office; provided that if the close of filing deadline falls on a 2009-0101 SB SMA.doc

1 Monday, no nomination papers shall be made available after the

Friday preceding the Monday filing deadline." 2

3 SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.

4 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
