BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 11, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended
2	by adding a new part to be appropriately designated and to read
3	as follows:
4	"PART . ELECTIONS ADVISORY COUNCIL
5	§11- Elections advisory council; creation; composition.
6	(a) There is established an elections advisory council under
7	the office of elections, to be appointed by the chief election
8	officer.
9	(b) The elections advisory council shall be composed of
10	representatives from the following entities, who shall be
11	selected by the entity:
12	(1) Alu Like;
13	(2) Association of Clerks and Election Officers of Hawaii;
14	(3) Association of Information Technology Professionals;
15	(4) Chamber of Commerce of Hawaii;
16	(5) Common Cause of Hawaii;
17	(6) Hawaii Newspaper Agency;

The 7 elections advisory council shall serve as an advisory group to 8 assist the chief election officer, as follows: 9 Provide the chief election officer with comments and (1) 10 recommendations on matters pertaining to federal, state, and county elections; 11 12 Provide the chief election officer with comments and (2) 13 recommendations on adopting rules and procedures; 14 (3) Serve as the core group of the official elections 15 observer team to watch over the counting center team 16 activities to ensure adherence to rules and procedures 17 on election day; Conduct logic and accuracy tests to verify that the 18 (4)19 ballot counting program is making accurate counts; and 20 (5) Observe other election-related activity, as authorized 21 by the chief election officer or designated 22 representative."
